Through a tumultuous campaign season and presidential election, accompanied by unprecedented violence, it became all the more important for us to lean on our faith foundation. In January, my 2020 started out with a wonderful continuing education opportunity in Carefree, AZ. I was able to gather with 3 of my good friends along with other pastors from around the country at a Lutheran retreat center. The focus of the seminar was business skills for pastors. I came back renewed and with new ideas, especially in the area of digital ministry. (Little did I know at the time, how quickly I would need to grow in that field.)

On the first full weekend in March, I gathered at Eagle Eyrie Retreat Center with CLC members and Lutherans from around Virginia for 2 different events. March 6-7 was the kickoff event for the Virginia Synod's Renew 145 ministry. Pastor Dave, Ken Schnur, Tom Magri, my son Micah and I gathered with others from around the synod to reflect on the strengths and growth areas of our congregations' ministries. Throughout the year, the group, which also includes Donna Furrow, has continued to meet to consider and plan how we can strengthen the faith of our congregation in general and how we can better meet the needs of our community. In 2021, watch for more details about upcoming small groups.

On March 7, I skipped out on the last Renew 145 session to meet up with our 5^{th} and 6^{th} graders who attended the Virginia Synod's annual overnight retreat, 7^{th} Day, also at Eagle Eyrie. What a blessed event it was to sing and learn and grow together! We were told many times that weekend to wash our hands. Little did we know that by the next Sunday, we would not be gathering in large groups again for the foreseeable future.

As the next week began, and fears for the COVID-19 pandemic grew, Pastor Dave and I began to plan how we might alter our weekly worship services and communion practices. By Thursday, we were cancelling in-person worship and planning an online service. After weeks and weeks of livestream worship only, Pentecost Sunday was a wonderful celebration in the parking lot. Those Drive-In services have continued since then and what a blessing they have been! Of course, both Easter and Christmas were different this year as well, but beautiful nonetheless.

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Thank you to all who shared their gifts of music, dance, reading, pictures and presence. A special thanks to Blue Blanchard for a wonderful pandemic Christmas Pageant too! Thank you to Josh Skole for keeping our services running, looking great online, and sounding good no matter how one participates! Thank you to Fiona Schulz for all her work behind the scenes and on Sunday mornings to coordinate all that's happening in the parking lot. Thanks to Nancy and Dave Delaney, Tom Magri, Kim Mucha, Cary Mangus, Michael Edwards, and Warren Burger for leading us in song on Sundays and Wednesdays! Thank you to the "Back-to-Worship" (in the building) Task Force for leading the way in the Drive-in services and planning ahead for how we will safely gather in the building in 2021 – Neil Dorsey, Debbie McCorkindale, Leah Savelyev, Sue Vail, George Keller, Donna and Larry Patton. We are blessed indeed.

In 2020, six of our youth affirmed their baptism in the Rite of Confirmation. We rescheduled from Pentecost to Reformation Day, and then rescheduled from Drive-in to livestream only due to weather, but it was a beautiful day nonetheless. I could not have been more proud of Franziska Borneff, Jackson Critzer, Gavin Dogan, Arthur Downs, Jacob Fariss and Riley Houtz. Confirmation ministry with 6th through 8th grade students looks different this school year too, but our families have risen to the occasion. 2020 moved us to grow our digital ministry in needed and wonderful ways. Our Sunday and Wednesday services are both livestreamed on Facebook every week. They are also posted on our website. Daily devotions are provided on Facebook and an online financial giving option was added to our website. Thank you so much to all of you who used both mail, drop off, and online giving to support our ministry! In 2021, I am planning a makeover for our website and would welcome your input.

In August, we celebrated 10 years of ministry together. Thank you so much to Pastor Dave and Fiona for the wonderful surprise gifts and the beautiful plaque! Thanks to all of you for your constant support and for the opportunity to serve our Lord together!

The Church Council met monthly throughout 2020 to oversee operations and finances of the congregation. Notable actions included:

- Council tracked attendance at services and discussed trends monthly.
- Council monitored, reviewed and when necessary approved budgetary allocation and trends monthly
- Reviewed car lease and health insurance package options for pastors / church staff
- Discussed and worked to address any issues that members of the congregation might be having due to online worship, in person parking lot worship and Covid-19 generally
- Approved repairs that were made to the roof in the kitchen area of the facility
- Monitored the installation and activation of the new online tithing method which has accounted for approximately 10% of all tithes
- Christ Lutheran Church served as a polling place for elections in May and November.
- Continued work to improve signage throughout the church facility
- Updated photo directory for CLC members should be available in early 2021
- Presently actively looking for volunteers to conduct an internal 2019 and 2020 financial audit
- Developed a task force for back to service worship as a result of Covid-19 restrictions
- Approved the proposed budget for 2021, which is to be presented to the congregation on December 13th
- New members standing for election to Council for 2021 to be voted on by the congregation on December 13th are Kristi Bayer Downs, Mike Ramsey, Kelly Zuber and Gudrun Freeman and youth representative Micah Keyser-Rothgery Council sent several thank-you cards to different church members for their dedicated service

Noah's Landing Preschool Director's Report 2020

The director and teachers of Noah's Landing Preschool met several times over the summer to discuss implementing the guidelines from the CDC and Virginia Social Services for opening a school/childcare during the COVID-19 pandemic. We surveyed our families to find out their feelings about returning to school with these guidelines in place and determined we had enough children and enough teachers willing to participate as well as permission from the church to be able to move forward with the school year. We began the 2020-2021 school year in September with a total enrollment of 19 children and 5 teachers. We are continuing with our same schedule of Monday through Thursday classes, but we have made numerous changes/adjustments to how we operate. A daily temperature check is taken of both the teachers and the children. The teachers wear face masks and many of the older children wear them although they are not required. The classes are kept separated from each other with no mixing for activities or playground time. We continue to clean and disinfect the classroom and toys and extra attention is being given to high touch areas (doorknobs, handrails). The toys in the classroom are limited and sanitized between uses. We are not offering early morning drop-off and Lunch Bunch is being held two days a week for an additional fee. We have eliminated field trips and are not offering our after school programs with Soccer Shots and Bricks 4 Kidz. In spite of all these changes, we feel we have created a normal routine for the children which offers support to our families during this challenging time.

We will begin registration for the 2021-2022 school year in late January - early February 2021. Preschool classes are held for children ages 15 months to 5 years old Monday - Thursday from 9am - 12noon with optional extended days until 1:00pm. The preschool continues to use several classrooms in the educational wing of the church during the week. We are very appreciative of the opportunity to use the church facilities.

The preschool curriculum centers on first-hand, direct experiences that are developmentally appropriate for young children. Opportunities for growth and development are provided in the areas of physical development (Creative Movement), social awareness, personal hygiene and safety, literature and language skills, art and creative expression, music, science and math, and spiritual growth (weekly chapel time with Pastor Dave).

Noah's Landing offers an excellent, experienced teaching staff and low teacher/student ratios. Within this atmosphere of love and trust, we hope to give each child a feeling of self-confidence and knowledge of God's love.

<u>Christian Education Committee</u> <u>2020 Year End Report</u>

The Christian Education Committee held Sunday School this year for ages Pre-K through adult in person until late March 2020. After that, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Sunday School offerings varied from virtual gatherings, mailings to be completed at home and some in-person meetings with masks and social distancing. The Pre-K through 5th grades use several Biblical based curriculums that include games, videos, art, cooking and science experiments (Spark and Holy Moly curriculums from Augsburg Fortress including a lectionary-based SPARK curriculum.) Arts and crafts projects were mailed to families to complete together at home. The children are working on a virtual Christmas program to be available to the congregation.

Grades 6 through 8 meet for Confirmation studies. This year they are studying <u>Luther's</u> <u>Small Catechism</u> and reviewing Lutheran prayers and interests. We have continued our mentor program for our 6th through 8th graders. Each student has been assigned an adult volunteer and they meet once a month for faith discussions. Classes have been virtual and occasionally in person meetings with masks and social distancing have been held.

High school students meet as a youth group for discussions on faith and current events. This may be in person with social distancing and masks, or virtually. They are encouraged to attend the Synod Youth events virtually as well.

Adult classes include ongoing Bible studies and some book studies. On October 25th, we had 6 youth confirm their Baptism through Confirmation: Franziska Borneff, Jackson Critzer, Gavin Dogan, Arthur Downs, Jacob Fariss and Riley Houtz.

Vacation Bible School and the Christmas pot-luck dinner were cancelled this year due to the pandemic.

Hopefully, we will be able to get back to "Coffee and a Prayer" by next fall at the latest.

Our website has been used more than ever this year to provide information, videos, worship bulletins, curriculum and more. If you have used it on a cell phone or tablet, however, you know it needs some updates. Pastor Cindy hopes to work on this project in 2021 and would welcome your input.

The Finance Committee met two (2) times in 2020 to oversee the financial ministry of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church:

February 6th:

- Wells Fargo Advisors representatives gave a brief overview of the church's investment program as it pertains to both the 2019 results and projections for the market for 2020. This annual meeting is a requirement of the church's approved 2014 investment policy.
- The 4th Quarter 2019 Wells Fargo Advisors Investment Report was reviewed and approved unanimously without comment.
- A brief overview was provided on the status of the funds related to the Capital Improvement Campaign which are maintained at both Wells Fargo Bank and Wells Fargo Advisors.
- Special Scholarship committee update was provided to the committee. The proposed guidelines were to be presented to the Higginbotham family for their review.
- Committee was updated on the organ pipe refurbishment project. Work was completed in time for Christmas 2019 program. Total spent was \$62,789 with funds to cover the cost coming from the Stultz Memorial.
- Committee was given an update on status of House #2 loan repayment the purchase of which was funded from the Tsuing Fund. The payment for 2019 was short due to having to replace both (i) the roof and (ii) the HVAC system on House #2. This shortage has been spread out over the remaining 8 years of the loan.

November 5th:

Meeting was held by ZOOM due to the continuing Covid-19 pandemic.

- The 3rd Quarter 2020 Wells Fargo Advisors Investment Report was reviewed and approved unanimously.
- A brief overview was provided on the status of the funds related to the Capital Improvement Campaign which are maintained at both Wells Fargo Bank and Wells Fargo Advisors.
- Church was the beneficiary of a bequest with no restrictions from the Estate of long time member Madge Clark.
- Discussion was held related to having Pastor's own their vehicles which are currently leased by the church under the signature of a Trustee. Discussion was tabled until a future meeting.
- 2021 Budget reviewed so as to make a proposal to Church Council for their vote at the November 10th meeting. Highlights from discussion:

Overall 2021 budget is essentially the same as current 2020. It was decided to not adjust the budget based on the continuing Covid-19 pandemic and not knowing when the church would open back up for in-person services. Small increase in health benefits for both Pastor's attributed to the difference between 2020 and 2021.

- Removed monies from Plant Operations that was designated to cover a new roof for rental House #1. Replacement delayed till 2022. Added monies to have the parking lots sealed and restriped which is a more immediate need. Committee proposed covering Pastor Cindy's cell phone cost beginning November 2020. This resulted in no increase to 2021 Budge. Motion made to approve the 2021 Budget for presentation to Church Council. Motion was passed unanimously.
- A request was made by Pastor Dave to pay a bonus to the church secretary for all the work she has done in 2020 to help prepare for weekly service (online and drive-in) and weekly communique that has been distributed to the church members. Payment would be made in 2020 with the understanding that this was a one-time payment with no guarantee of any future payments. Motion was made and approved unanimously and sent to Church Council for review and discussion.

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Summary:

- Thanks to the Finance Committee members for their assistance and participation in overseeing the finances of the church during 2020.
- Thanks also to the hard work by both Judy Addison and Joyce Noell for making sure the church's finances are kept in order. Their dedication is appreciated and it should be noted that they continue to do this important work as volunteers.
- A final thanks to the members of Christ Lutheran Church for their continued financial support of the ministry of the church during this extraordinary year. Any questions regarding the contents of this report, please let me know.

The dining room at the <u>**RAM House**</u> was shut down mid-March 2020 due to Covid-19. The RAM kitchen immediately switched to bagged lunches, assisted by volunteers who felt able to continue their volunteering in the RAM kitchen. They continued to provide lunches to the homeless and to whomever felt a need for lunch, even if they had a home -7 days a week, every day of the year.

Christ Lutheran began providing bagged lunches March 27 and since then, we have provided 70 to 150 of these lunches every 2 to 3 weeks - as of January 8, 18 times – 1600 lunches. Our lunches are put together in our Fellowship Hall by 4 or 5 of our members and then delivered to the RAM House, where they are given out. Our bagged lunches are basic – a turkey & cheese sandwich, two homemade cookies, 2 or 3 clementine oranges, a small bag of chips and a bottle of water. But RAM's staff and clients have greatly appreciated our lunches – "something different", Paula Moore, RAM's kitchen manager, has told me. We have a small group of Christ Lutheran bakers who make the cookies each time.

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And now, when I arrive at RAM to deliver our lunches, the volunteers always ask if we've included these cookies! Something special, made with love.

Some people volunteer to make the sandwiches and put the lunch bags together. Others donate the food items for the lunches – some, every time; others, when they can. Others have donated money to buy the needed items because they need to stay home – to stay safe from Covid-19. And some use their gift and love of baking. Many others support RAM with prayers and with love. We have a group of 45 Christ Lutheran angels who regularly do something to provide lunches and love to those who go to RAM for lunch and for support. Some of RAM's clients are there most of the time, even before Covid-19 arrived. Some went to RAM years ago - and now need them again. Some have never needed RAM before now. Thank you for the amazing generosity and love you have given to these people – our sisters and brothers in Christ – our neighbors.
