
Sew on and Sew Forth

Program: 3D and Illusion Quilting Christopher Weinhold

Through a slide show and quilt samples we will explore the history of 3D quilting as well as the design and development of the "Escher" quilts. These quilts are not actual MC Escher designs, but rather inspired by his work in the 3D art world. Christopher will also share other quilts he has designed and patterns he has written.





Escher – Kaffe August 29

This pattern is the third in a series of MC Escher inspired quilts. Bold prints work well in the construction of this quilt. The cubes along with the original Escher Y's make for a fabulously dimensional quit. No Y seams used in construction makes this project simpler than the complex design appears.

July 25, 2022

In-Person and Zoom Virtual Meeting

The July meeting was a special one in two respects. Thirty-six members attended the meeting and enjoyed purchasing donated quilting items at the huge rummage sale. Items ranged from fabric to books and supplies and included special silent auction pieces. Funds from the sale are used to pay for Guild programs.

The meeting was also unique because it included a quilt judging by Kitty Friend. Fifteen Guild members joined those in-person to watch the judging online. While members who submitted quilts benefited from Kitty's feedback about their work, all Guild members had an opportunity to hear Kitty discuss judging criteria and tips about submitting quilts to be judged. Quilts were included in six categories (lap quilts, crib quilts, charity quilts, wall hangings, tablerunners/tabletoppers, and first judged entry). Kitty gave first, second and third place ribbons in each of the categories (except first time entry where there was only one!). Mary Wolter helped organize and facilitate the judging. Several members mentioned how much they appreciated this program.

Tips from Kitty and Mary

What does a judge look for—and what matters!

Pet hair is a big no no! So is dirt!

No fraying on raw edge applique

No start/stop lines showing

A miniature quilt has to have miniature binding....no 1/4 inch

Corners need to be 90°

Long arm/free motion - 10 stitches per inch is too big

Lots of seams makes a wart! Pressing open will minimize that

Winner is the usually the one with the most techniques

Ribbons don't have to be awarded—just because you are the only entry does not guarantee a ribbon

Never use dots for the binding. They don't line up well.

Stitch the corners!
