Kitchen Water Heater

The kitchen water heater has generally been left on permanently, meaning that there is always instant hot water but electricity is used to keep water permanently heated that often isn't used. In order to save electricity it has been suggested that we only switch it on only when needed. Having raised this with the General Purposes Committee and spoken to a number of users, it seems that there is agreement that the heater should only be switched on when required. Smaller users can use kettles but if a larger amount of hot water is needed it will be necessary to switch the heater on about half an hour in advance.

Please therefore switch of the water heater after use, unless you are aware that another group will require hot water within the next hour or two. If this causes any issues we will of course review it.
