LWML NEWS

I attended the Chesapeake District convention from Sept. 21 to 23 along with our church administrator Ashley who was the DCMarVa Young Woman Representative. While we were there Teresa Tester from Lutheran Church of Our Savior (also known as LCOOS) in Bryan's Road was elected President of the entire Chesapeake District. I also met other LWMLers from Trinity. We voted on the ministry budget and where we would like to have our mission grants go to for the next two years.

The following grants are listed in the order that they will be paid:

- 1. Orphan Grain Train, making a trip to Shipment to Duk, Sudan
- 2. Newport News helping a Lutheran Soup kitchen purchase a new gas stove
- 3. Faith and Work Ministries a faith-based work training program in Baltimore
- 4. Deaconess Training classes for Latina Women
- Student Aid Grants for Concordia Students
- 6. St John's Lutheran School in Dover
- 7. Lutheran Heritage Foundation who translates the books we use for training like "Luther's Small Catechism" and Bible stories for children so they are available in their language (On a side note they are sending me a copy of the children's Bible stories in the Hmong language for my bilingual niece whose father is Hmong and not a Christian but he is the only one in the family able to read this book to her. They are helping me try to make an eternal impact on this family.)
- 8. Tuition and Bibles for students at Trinity in Richmond
- 9. Wyneken Outreach an outreach to the blind in Baltimore, translating the Bible and other materials into braille for them to use during worship

Tuesday, November 27th, 2018 is "Giving Tuesday". On that day, anonymous donors that will double any donations given up to \$20,000. These are all worthy causes and you can stretch your donation by donating on that particular day. I will make sure that we have the directions printed in the bulletin the week before.

I do want to say thank you to those who donated toward the Mite Walk. We raised \$130 to go toward the grants. We also donated toiletries, food, diapers and baby clothing items toward the other offerings given during the weekend.

I was thinking about how we could proceed to band our women together to do God's work here and in our community. I also discussed the possibility of doing joint events with Trinity. I was thinking about starting a woman's Prayer Breakfast in the odd months (Nov, Jan, March, etc.). Please let me know what you think. I was also thinking that on the even months we could have a meeting one evening during the week. I am working with the ladies at LCOOS to help me better organize our women to be "Lutheran Woman in Mission".

They have already announced that the Lutheran's Woman's Retreat will be in Ocean City, MD November 1st to the 3rd, 2019. I will be there. If people would like to go but are worried about funding then let me know because we could start now and plan a fund raiser or two to help cover some of the costs with attending.

I know that I have said it before but I believe it is worth repeating...if you are a woman who attends a Lutheran Church than you are part of the LWML, there are no other requirements. It is really just a matter of joining each other in an effort to be part of a community. As Deacon Gary has stated before, if St Paul's ceased to exist, would we be missed? It also gives us a sense of community in our church.

Have a great month and enjoy the beauty of God's creation as the leaves change color and the temperature starts to cool. I love this time of year!
