Funkdaddies will be performing their 20th anniversary show, Saturday, May 27 at the Amana Performing Arts Center, Amana. This five-piece group is an lowa legend having performed with some of the biggest names in the business and carving their own story in the midwestern soul – rock scene. The acoustic duo Hudson Road is performing 1 – 4 at Fireside Winery, Sunday May 28. They'll have the bag toss set up too at Fireside Winery.

Amana Disc Golf Course Set-Up Underway The location for Amana's new disc golf course has been moved to the Price Creek area behind the Village Winery and the Amana Woolen Mill/ Hotel Millwright where course designer Steve Kepker, a professional disc golfer and Iowa course designer, has created the course and staked the holes.

The Amana Society is working with the Amana Colonies Visitor Center which received a recreation grant from the Iowa County Community Foundation for the new course. Amana Forestry, Tim Krauss, is undertaking the installation of the disc golf baskets and signs. Each basket will be set up so that they can be removed in the event of flooding. A free will donation kiosk will be installed as well. The first disc basket will be located between the Army Corps of Engineers pump house near Price Creek not far from the Village Winery in Amana. This will allow the public to park near Hotel Millwright and the Woolen Mill and walk to shops and restaurants before or after they play the course.

The course will be created so that all levels of play will find it appealing, yet challenging. Disc golf is growing in popularity for all ages. It is easy to learn, entertaining to play and allows for a nice walk with a purpose, as one local fan of the game explained to me.

It's anticipated that the Amana course will be ready to use by the end of June or early July.

Disc golf is a game that's similar to golf but players use Frisbee-like disks instead of clubs and a ball to play. The professional disc golf association boasts over 200,000 members and it hosts major tournaments in every state. The association known as USDGC (US Disc Golf Championships) reports that over 4 million play disc golf and that number is growing. Last year the National Champion was crowned at the USDGC championships at Winthrop University, South Carolina. The winner: Gannon Buhr of Urbandale, Iowa who won by 1 throw. Thus far in 2023 young Buhr has won over \$120,000 in prizes and purses playing disc golf.

I wonder what it was like in communal Amana when you were expected to go to church 11 times a week. Every evening you had night prayer in the "Kleine Saal" (small meeting room) near your home, then on Wednesday you were divided into categories;children, middle, and elderly or more "pious". Finally came Sunday with three services held in the "Grosse Saal" (main meeting room).

One wonders if it might not have made more sense to just remain in church on Sunday instead of going home to eat, take a walk, or read from some theological text.

My mother was a real stickler for showing up on time. She would make sure we were dressed and ready to go at least 15-20 minutes before the beginning of each service.

It was a point of honor for her if she could be sitting on her bench before Richard Seifert who lived in the Homestead church.

Richard did not like this at all, his ears would wiggle when he was upset. Mother would smile and sort of snicker when this happened. Kathryn and I who sat on the bench in front of her would sigh

knowing full well we would once again hear how she had beat him to church. We would proceed to count window pains and try really hard to appear pious.

During Holy Week the congregation kept coming earlier and earlier until the elders finally would decide since everyone was in church they might as well start early.

Well, there is always one exception, you know, that one person you don't start anything until they arrive.

In Homestead it was Helen D. It didn't matter that her husband and daughter were Vorsanger and were already "in place ---- " she was coming in her own good time. I thought I should be the last one in because of my claustrophobia, but she must have had it worse then I.

Then there was the men's side. They always came in as a group, or "herd." I often wondered why they waited so long to come in.

Perhaps it was talk of a baseball game or who got the most rain. No matter what they were and still are some of the last to come in, BUT there is one man who straggles in at the very end. He even has to check the door to make sure it's firmly shut.

Usually it's the bell ringer or Charlemagne. He has his own timetable that revolves around reading the paper, feeding the birds, weeding the garden, or most importantly finishing dessert.

He's the perfect consort for me (the Queen) because as I am off to various places he is always 6 paces behind me going at his own speed.

Well, it has been since 11 trips to church a week, so I guess Charlemagne is safe, my mother (as have I) gave up on his time table long ago.
