

Are Those Really Dolphins?

No, you aren't seeing things! Those really are dolphins you are seeing out in the Rappahanock, in the Corrotoman - and even in Senior Creek!

The Chesapeake Bay hasn't been this healthy in 33 years. A healthier Bay means our rivers and creeks are healthier with a prolific amount of fish, which makes for prime feeding for dolphins!

If you do see a dolphin pod out on the river or creek, enjoy them from a distance—300 feet between humans and marine mammals is required by federal law. However, passive interaction when dolphins willingly swim around or approach you or your boat—is perfectly legal. Dolphins may even choose to playfully surf swells generated by a vessel. As fall approaches, dolphin spotting will become few and far between before venturing toward warmer waters for the winter. Enjoy them while you can! And when you do see them, please help the University of Maryland track them by reporting your sightings here: https://chesapeakedolphinwatch.

Speaking of a Healthy Bay . . .

Since we are a waterfront community (whether you fish or crab off the CBTB dock or have waterfront property), it is your responsibility to help keep the water clean and report both water contamination, like improper dumping, or watercraft violations to the Virginia Marine Resources Commission.

Annual Assessment Collection Update

Final reminder letters have been sent to those CBTB Association property owners who have failed to pay their 2018 assessment plus fees etc. which were due March 1, 2018. We request all payments be to Rivers Accounting by September 1, 2018.

Accounts not brought up to date by that date will be turned over to our attorney William Hubbard of Hubbard, Terry and Britt. This turnover takes the collection process out of our hands and puts it into the legal system resulting in liens, judgments and potentially foreclosures along with the negative impact on individuals credit ratings. In addition, additional costs and expenses are added by the legal system.

CBTB's actions towards two property owners of foreclosure at this time have resulted in one party paying the Association/Attorney the amount due thereby eliminating that foreclosure. The parties involved in the other foreclosure declared bankruptcy thereby delaying the foreclosure until the bankruptcy court rules.

Needless to say CBTB does not desire to turn any property owner's account over to the attorney, much less go forward with the foreclosure process. We ask all our property owners to be responsible and pay the annual assessment in a timely manner so that your Association does not have to incur the additional expenses of the collection and legal process.

If you find yourself in a hardship situation, contact Vicki at Rivers Accounting 804-436-9211 and work out a plan of payment.

Please pay your CBTB assessments. We do not desire to cause you and your Association more expense by turning your account over to the attorney.

What Does My Pool Fee Cover Anyway?

We often get questioned about the \$100 annual pool fees and what it covers. More or less this money helps offset the day-to-day cost of operating and maintaining the pool.

For Fiscal Year 2018, (our fiscal year runs March to February), CBTB budgeted \$4,325 for pool operations (chemicals, cleaning, etc.), \$2,000 for repairs and \$956 for water for a total of \$7,281, which is pretty close to the \$7,100 collected in pool fees.

Actual costs, of course, may, and will for this year, exceed budgeted costs. Pool repairs for this year have already exceeded \$4,000 and we may be looking at more after the pool closes. Likewise, the leak that was found will increase water usage beyond the amount budgeted.

These unanticipated costs will not affect this year's pool fees but hopefully will be covered by other budget savings.



Are You Ready?

Being a coastal community, we sometimes experience heavy rains, strong winds, flooding - and yes, even the occasional hurricane. The Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30, with the peak occurring between mid-August and late October. Here are some tips from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management to prepare for a storm:

Prepare Your Home

- Bring loose, lightweight objects such as patio furniture, garbage cans and bicycles inside.
- Anchor objects that would be unsafe to bring inside (e.g., gas grills and propane tanks).
- Trim or remove damaged trees and limbs close enough to fall on structures.
- Secure loose rain gutters and downspouts and clear any clogged areas or debris to prevent water damage to your property.
- Purchase a portable generator or install a wholehouse generator for use during power outages.
- Keep alternative power sources, such as a portable
- generator, outside, at least 20 feet away from the house, and protected from moisture.
- Document the condition of your home prior to the storm.

And if you wondered, here are the hurrican categories and wind speeds:

Category	Wind Speed	Damage
1	74-95 MPH	Some
2	96-110 MPH	Extensive
3	111-129 MPH	Devastating
4	130-156 MPH	Catastrophic
5	157+ MPH	Catastrophic

And let's hope we don't need it, but in the event of a power outage (storm or otherwise), remember the CBTB Clubhouse has an automatic generator so you can charge your electronics and step into air conditioning (or heat). And it is a good idea to program the number to report power outages to Northern Neck Electric into your phone 866-663-2688. And for their power outage map go to: http://outages.nnec.coop

tion. Directors so chosen shall hold office until the next annual election and until their successors are duly elected and shall qualify." In addition, an amendment was added to Article VII, Section 3, of the Bylaws in 1998 that states: "Directors so chosen shall complete the term of office."
