

Status of New Building By Paul Mehrkam

The mission plan for building is to understand how much money we will need. Having a cost estimate will allow the congregation to seriously consider our church budget and offerings to ensure that we can initially fund construction and sustain the new building. Keep in mind that funds are also needed to renovate the existing church.

Such estimates include the following:

- excavation
- poured concrete basement
- framing
- roofing
- siding
- plumbing
- electrical
- ... and the list goes on.

At some point, the building committee



will tour the facilities of different churches. Much can be learned from their trials and after thoughts. This would help immensely with our future decisions in design, function, and the type of materials used. For example: lighting, plumbing fixtures, tile for restrooms. These things can vary in price but they can make or break the overall appearance which is important. Please let the building committee know if you are interested in participating on these tours.

Another effort is underway to help us visualize our new building. Some of you may have seen the 3D rendering of the church exterior on the bulletin board in the narthex. From the left, you can see the main entrance, the windows in a cross shape, and two emergency exits for the fellowship hall.

Thoughts on...Stewardship By Dianne Nichols

What's the SCARIEST WORD in the English language?

COMMITMENT

Why do you say that, Dianne???

Because so many of us RUN from it. We: are OVER committed, REFUSE to commit, have commitment PHOBIA, CAN"T Commit, or NEGLECT the commitments we have made.

BOTTOM LINE: We DON'T commit because we let the "What if's " of life over shadow us... What if it doesn't work out? What if I lose my job? What if it's a scam? What if I'm too hungry, thirsty, tired, depressed that day?

The Psalmist says, "COMMIT your way to the LORD: TRUST in Him...and He will do this..." (Psalm 37.5) and in Proverbs 16:3, "COMMIT to the LORD whatever you do, and your plans will succeed."

Hmm, so COMMITMENT is really about TRUST. Do we TRUST God enough to do what He says He will do?

Here at St. Paul's, we say we are trusting God to help us develop a building plan so that we can serve Him better by serving our surrounding community. But do we TRUST Him enough to COMMIT to this project through the SACRIFICIAL GIVING that it will take to get this building done?

The apostle Paul understood how hard it was for congregations to do this....and he had a plan: "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up....so that when I come... (we can) send them with your gift to Jerusalem." I Corinthians 16: 1-3.

It doesn't matter if your financial COMMITMENT is large or small, the important thing is that you TRUST God enough to MAKE the COMMITMENT - and then let HIM do the work. Paul continues his message to the Corinthians by saying.

"This service you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people, but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, men will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the Gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else." II Corinthians 9:12-13

COMMIT your way to the LORD; TRUST in Him and He WILL do this.






Welcome to the first "From the Tool Shed" report. Quite a lot has happened in the last few months. Lawn maintenance is well under way. Thank you everyone who signed up to cut the grass it has been a big help. So far no one has had to cut twice. The Main Church Building is getting all dressed up with a fresh coat of paint around the Windows and Door ways thanks to Alan Hunter. A large crew assembled in June to weed the playground and add a much needed blanket of mulch thanks to the coordination of John Bowling. In June our Air Conditioner in the Sanctuary decided to retire. I was able to work with Donnie's Heating and Air Conditioning, who replaced our Boiler, to replace the aged equipment with an updated high efficiency Air Conditioning unit with a Heat Pump. The added Heat Pump will help lower our heat costs on those chilly days. During the colder days and during the winter the Boiler will still provide us that much needed warmth we all love.

I am working with Donnie to obtain an estimate to add permanent Air and Heat to Pastor's office and Lorrie's office. I am hoping to have a Building day in late September to address some maintenance that is needed on the Education Building. A big Thank-You to everyone who has been assisting with the maintenance and upkeep of the Building and Grounds.




Cemetery Plots

Nearly 40 kids came through our doors each day to experience God's love

Hope they are for all those who attended as well, because knowing God is with us and loves us no matter if we feel left out or different, afraid, do wrong, or just don't understand the complexities of life around us will keep us smiling every day! We are a country of many blessings and it is hard for our children to even comprehend what many people in other parts of the world live like or that the water they drank and washed with was often dirty. As a result we collected over \$97 dollars to support this" Operation Kid to Kid" mission program. We will continue to collect donations from the congregation as well for the next 2 weeks. 


