



Tech Talk #77

Who's Looking After Whom?

You don't have to be Sherlock Holmes to have investigative instincts, but by trade, you already possess your own investigative talents. Your instincts can be of additional use in other areas as well...the observation of people, vehicles, etc. In fact, one can even increase one's awareness just by watching one of the today's television programs (*Forensic Files, CSI*, etc). The key elements of awareness, observation, and cleanliness are all important items in an investigation. However, memory retention, or being able to recall events and give a description in an exact manner, will not occur if a surprise element is added.

For instance, you can take 20 persons gathered on a street corner and stage a crime (without their knowledge) in front of them involving the discharge of a firearm and/or a grotesque event. Take them one-by-one for a statement, and you will have multiple descriptions (i.e. color of clothing, shoes, race, height, weight, vehicle information, type of firearm/if any, etc). Some of these may be correct, but the majority of misinformation from the others will contradict actual accounts. Remembering information is somewhat easy, but if the element of surprise or shock is added, all bets are off (i.e., gunshots, horrific scene, etc). Having been associated with multiple law officers, and having been through the mill a time or two, here are some helpful hints.

OBSERVATION: If you've ever made a statement such as, "Oh yeah, that vehicle was parked there for three weeks," this is a good indication that you may need to sharpen your skills. If a vehicle is peculiar or has been parked in the same place for some time, or seems peculiar, take a look, but don't touch anything! People or persons that look peculiar or out of place are usually just that...out of place! When this occurs, take notes or mentally make notes of details! If you're uncertain if the vehicle just parks in the same place every day, simply place a rock or object on top of a tire. If it's gone the next day...the vehicle has been moved.

DETAILS: "Blah B, Blue T, Tan, Nike, 510/200" may not mean anything, but this is an easy way to remember a description of a person from the top down (i.e., black hair, brown eyes, blue t-shirt, tan pants, athletic shoes, 5' 10" tall, around 200 lbs). Other needed/missing details are type/length of hair, facial hair, race, etc., but you're on a good start. If the incident involves a vehicle, color, make, model, license number, or other identifiable marks (down to the type of rims and tires) are equally as important.

ACTION: If you come in one morning and see a vehicle that seems peculiar, take a look. Chances are that it is just someone who broke down, or it could be a needed piece of evidence. Other chances are that someone got ripped off and are anxiously awaiting information on their prized possession.

First off and most important...be careful! There could be someone inside sleeping it off, or worse, an actual crime in progress. Secondly, make sure no one is in the vehicle! Third, don't touch anything! On too many occasions, persons contaminate evidence. Fourth, you should have already imprinted, or at least written down information, regarding the vehicle. Fifth, observe if the vehicle is mechanically intact (i.e., flat tire, leaking fluids, etc). Sixth, observe if the vehicle is secure (if the windows are up and doors are locked, don't touch). Seventh, see if the steering column/ignition switch is broken out. Eighth, never ever forget to check the trunk for smells, body fluids, or noises from inside. And finally, take pictures if possible!

REACTION: Your reactions to your actions are important as well. If you've followed the action path above, you've probably already determined if there is anything to this or not. If there were something wrong or out of ordinary, your proper reaction would be to notify the police and gather your information about this incident (using the "back" of your hand on the hood to check for heat can give an indication of how long the vehicle has been there). Study the site for helpful information (for example, are there any cameras which may have caught the vehicle when it was parked?).


It will be your information that will be beneficial to the detectives in the event something has occurred. Accurate details and any other information will more easily be at hand because you are more familiar with the area than the police department.

Perhaps your careful observations will find a vehicle stolen from somebody who desperately needs it or discover a missing clue to getting the ball rolling regarding a missing person (who cannot be reported unless conclusive evidence is found or the required 48-72 hours has passed).


