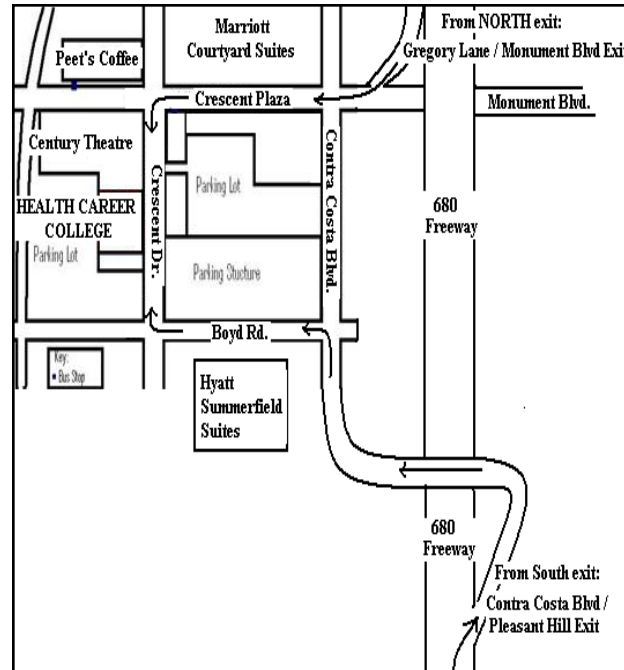

Phlebotomy Technician Program

The Phlebotomy Technician Program is for the motivated adult seeking a new medical career as a certified Phlebotomist. The program will prepare the graduate to become an allied health professional with skills to perform the duties of a Phlebotomist in various clinical laboratories. The program includes 100 hours of didactic course and laboratory, and 40 hours of clinical externship (*to be completed within 4 weeks*). Lectures in the didactic course include but not limited to anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, phlebotomy procedures, advance phlebotomy procedures and office procedures. Clinical externship at our affiliated laboratory provides hands-on training in venipuncture technique. During this clinical externship students are required by California Department of Public Health Services-Laboratory Field Services to obtain 40 hours of practical training and a minimum 50 successful venipunctures and 10 dermal skin punctures. All clinical experience will be supervised by an licensed phlebotomy instructor. Completion of this course will not automatically qualify a graduate to work as a Phlebotomist. However, once a student successfully achieved the assessment for skills and competency, he/she will enable to sit for the national exam. Participants who passed the exam, and successfully completed the required hours and number of venipunctures will enable to apply for California Department of Public Health Services, Laboratory Field Services state License.

- High School Diploma or GED
- Form of Picture ID (drivers license, passport, State ID, or Travel Visa)
- Proof of Medical Insurance

Externship Requirements:

- Current TB screening test (PPD)*within past 6 months
- Vaccinations: Hepatitis B (must be within 10 years)
- Current CPR/BLS (America Heart Association)
- Background Check (www.backgroundcheck.com)

EKG Technician Program

The Program provides the basic fundamentals in Electrocardiogram (EKG). Completion of the program will allow students to become an allied health professional with skills to perform the duties of an EKG Technician in various clinical settings. This program includes 100 hours of didactic course and laboratory. We provide different course lengths of either 10 weeks or the fast-track section in 4 weeks. Lectures includes anatomy and physiology of the heart, various normal and abnormal heart rhythms, Holter (24hour) EKG monitoring, EKG Treadmill (Stress) test, Telemetry (Cardiac Intensive Care Unit monitoring, 12 lead EKG, patient care, patient confidentiality and medical ethics. After completion of program, students will be qualified to sit for the EKG National Board. (CET and CCT), given by National Health Career Assoc. (NHA) and Certified Cardiographic Technician (CCT), respectively.

- High School Diploma or GED
- Form of Picture ID (drivers license, passport, State ID, or Travel Visa)
- Proof of Medical Insurance

COMBINING: *Phlebotomy, EKG, and Medical Assisting (Medical Assisting can be substituted with either Certified Nursing Assisting, Emergency Medical Technician), would enable the student to qualify and challenge the Patient Care Technician and Medical Assisting national board exam. Comprehensively, students will achieve 5 separate licenses.*

Medical Assisting Program

This Program is for a motivated adult looking for an allied health profession in the field of Medical Assisting. The program prepares the graduate to become an allied health professional with skills to perform the duties of a medical assistant in various clinical settings. The program includes 8 1/2 months of didactic course and laboratory, and 1 1/2 months of clinical externship. Lectures in the didactic course include courses in anatomy & physiology, clinical component such as infection control, phlebotomy and EKG course, administrative computer applications, clinical procedures, confidentiality, medical ethics, as well as basic front office and back office procedure to ensure competency. Clinical externship at our affiliated hospitals and laboratories provides hands-on training in medical assisting. Completion of the course will not automatically qualify graduate to work as Medical Assistant. However, once a student successfully achieved the assessment for skills and competency and the clinical externship, he/she will enable to sit for the national board exam. Participants who passed the exam will enable to apply for licenses for the following field Medical Assisting, Phlebotomy and EKG. These licenses graduates can work in a medical office, Laboratory, Hospital, or in the Emergency Room (ER) as an ER Technician.

- Scholastic Level Exam, Entrance Exam (passing score of 12)
- High School Diploma or GED
- Form of Picture ID (drivers license, passport, State ID, or Travel Visa)
- Proof of Medical Insurance

Externship Requirements:

- Current TB screening test (PPD)*within past 6 months
- Vaccinations: Hepatitis B (must be within 20 years)
- Current CPR/BLS (America Heart Association)
- Background Check

Total Program Hours: 1,084 Hours (3 months)

Program Fees: \$9,000, including lab supplies and externship. (\$3,000 for HCC returning students with Phlebotomy license and EKG certificate.)
