Reason to be Quiet Before God...

Luke 5:15 "Yet the news about Him spread all the more, so that crowds of people came to hear Him and to be healed of their sicknesses. ¹⁶ But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed."

One Friday, I had to be in two different places; one was in the morning at a divorce court for my good friend, and the other was a wedding in the afternoon. The divorce court was somewhat full of unwelcome spirits. I felt the sense of tension, frustration, and even sadness. Then at the wedding, the place was full of happiness and excitement. All the people looked lighted-hearted and were delighted with the newlyweds. My heart also cheered for this couple.

But, to be honest, at the wedding I was still in the mood of the divorce court. The gloomy faces of the husband and wife were still swimming in my head. I had to put on a good face. My emotions had to extremely change from this end to that end. Was I faking? Pretending? Should I have said to the new couple, "I am not in the mood of celebrating your new life?" I know it would have been awkward if I said that. My emotions swung on both sides of the fence.

Later that afternoon when coming back to my place, I couldn't focus on my sermon. Setting my mind into the scriptural context was hard, as well as finding a practical application. I noticed that my emotions were still swayed by the two events and my heart was heavily distracted.

Then, later that night, while alone in my room I set aside all the things that happened to me during the day. I truly focused on me, then discovered my own emotions. I found the sense of who I truly am, and who I truly should be. Then the accounts of the Scripture came to me in a real setting. The stories in the Bible became my stories.

That's why we need to be alone before God every day in our lives, to find who we truly are, and see who God wants us to be. We lay down all those moments that we have to put on different faces in this society, and come to God, who knows our deepest hearts, and searches for our sincerity. We won't have to go beyond the boundary of who we truly need to be. Then we can hear God whisper in our ears, the smallest sound.



Faith at the Olympics—Rio's Best Kept Secret

We've all heard the story of Eric Liddell, who turned down an opportunity for Olympic gold at the Paris Games in 1924 in order to honor His Savior. It was Liddell who famously said, "God made me fast. And when I run, I feel His pleasure."

Well, this summer in Rio de Janeiro, there's been a whole *lot* of running, jumping, swimming, and competing by athletes seeking to honor Jesus Christ. Not that you've heard much about it from the "mainstream" media. I spoke about this media blackout with my friend Terry Mattingly, who's one of today's foremost religion journalists. Terry told me, "If these athletes make faith a part of their story,

how do you leave out faith when telling their story?" Come to BreakPoint.org for a link to the podcast.

Now, I've already told you the story of super-swimmer Michael Phelps, who reached the pinnacle of sports and found it hollow—and then contemplated suicide. But Phelps found a reason to live when Ray Lewis gave him a copy of "The Purpose-Driven Life," by Rick Warren. Michael's story reminds us of the role that God's people have as bringers of hope and agents of restoration.

There have been many such reminders in Rio. Fiji dominated Great Britain, 43-7 in rugby, earning the island country's first-ever gold medal. Then the winning players huddled and sang, both in English and Fijian: "We have overcome / We have overcome / By the blood of the Lamb / And the Word of the Lord / We have overcome." Then they received their medals humbly—on their knees!

In the women's 10,000 meters race, Almaz Ayana, from Ethiopia, obliterated the previous world record by 14 seconds. Responding to unfounded rumors about cheating, Almaz retorted, "My doping is my training and my doping is Jesus. Nothing otherwise —I am crystal clear."

American swimmer Simone Manuel set an Olympic record in the 100-meter freestyle, becoming the first African-American woman to win gold as a swimmer, the first African-American woman to win a medal in an individual swimming event, and the first American to win the 100-meter since 1984. After the race she said, with tears rolling down her cheeks, "All I can say is all glory to God."

Then there's another inspiring Olympian named Simone—Simone Biles, acknowledged to be the world's greatest female gymnast—and perhaps the best ever. But what's truly inspiring is her story—adopted at age 6 by her grandparents because of her mother's battle with addiction. Now reconciled with her mom, Simone draws strength from her relationship with God and her faith.

Katie Ledecky, who may become the greatest woman swimmer of all time—and who won the 800-meter freestyle by an amazing 11 seconds—says her faith in Christ "is part of who I am."

I could go on and on in this Olympic hall of faith, but I'll leave you with just one more. Champion diver David Boudia says he's well aware of the need to represent Christ with integrity, saying, "If I represent a good God, I need to be that visual representation of him all the time, not just when I feel like it." David tells his amazing and inspiring story from despair to discipleship in his book, "Greater Than Gold: From Olympic Heartbreak to Ultimate Redemption."

It's great to see these "bringers of hope and agents of restoration" compete for the glory of God. But we'd miss the point if all we do is applaud them and then turn off our TVs. We are called to compete for Christ, too. As Eric Liddell also said, "It has been a won-

derful experience to compete in the Olympic Games and to bring home a gold medal. But ... I have had my eyes on a different prize. ... Each one of us is in a greater race than any I have run in Paris, and this race ends when God gives out the medals."

Amen. Now that is a story worth repeating!

Thoughts for the Journey—How We Worship...

THE WORSHIP OF GOD IS THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITHA ND CENTER OF OUR LIFE TOGETHER IN THE CHURCH. The Westminster Shorter Catechism affirms that our chief end in life is "to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." This places the worship of God at the very center of what it means to be God's people and makes worship the highest expression we can render to our God-given humanity. Christian worship is a corporate act of the people of God where we gather to realize God's presence and respond with praise to God's gift of love to us in Jesus Christ.

The next several months this column will focus individual acts of worship that take place each Sunday.

- 3. **THE WELCOME AND RITUAL OF FRIENDSHIP**—is an opportunity to welcome visitors, make necessary announcements, and bring to the attention of the membership timely events in the life of our church.
- 4. **THE CALL TO WORSHIP**—draws our attention from our many concerns to the primary concern of the moment. Through words drawn from Scripture, we are led toward God, and invited; "Come, let us worship."
- 5. **THE HYMNS OF PRAISE**—reflects the fundamental purpose of Christian worship. Praise is the people's joyful response to God's gift in Jesus Christ. These hymns are chosen to be uplifting and vibrant, reflecting the praise we seek to offer to our God.

Let's begin to approach our morning of worship as we enter the Sanctuary—directing our hearts and minds towards our gracious God in order to glorify Him and give ourselves totally to Him in praise and worship.
