

career highs with seven points and three assists and became the 35th player in program history to reach 100 career points when he assisted on a Robertson goal a minute into the third quarter. The Dartmouth game was the second highest scoring game in program history (24 goals). Princeton beat Brown 24-13.

Letter from the undergraduate president Margaret McCallister

To the Tiger Inn Family, As the new President of The Tiger Inn I wish to bring you news of our new Bicker class and update you with other membership news. This February brought more than 180 sophomores through our doors seeking membership. After three days of discussions we accepted 41 women and 38 men, for TI's first ever class with a female majority.

This year's class is an accomplished group of people. From Facebook's newest hire, Kat Xiao, to former rhythmic gymnast for the US National Team, Serena Lu, our new sophomore class offers a diverse and exciting perspective in the club. This year 3 female Army ROTC cadets joined our membership. Grace Searle, Anne Marie Wright, and Kasey Bersh. We have an array of new leaders for example, Jackson Caputo president of the Class of 2020 and Isaac Wolfe acting president of the Chabad Student Board. Grace Searle, a female cadet, also volunteers for the national suicide prevention and crisis management hotline, CONTACT, and staffs the on-campus hotline co-founded by another TI member Shana Salomon: Princeton Peer Nightline. Grace said, "Volunteering allows me to make impacts outside of the Tiger Inn and Princeton bubbles and constantly teaches me new ways to be a better friend, listener, and community member." New member Sarah Gordon has worked closely with Girl Up, a campaign of the United Nations Foundation that works to empower teenage girls in the United States to raise funds and awareness about the rights of girls around the world. Sarah served as one of 18 international Teen Advisors selected to drive the direction of the campaign for two consecutive years and then interned for Girl Up for a summer. Casey Kemper '20 is co-chair of the Mental Health Initiative (MHI) on campus. The MHI board mission is two-fold: to challenge current stigmatization of mental health at Princeton to foster a healthy and compassionate environment, and to pursue mental health reform at an institutional level.

The accomplishments of this year's bicker class extend into athletics as well. Gabe Morgan competed on the US Junior National Squash team for two consecutive years.

The team placed 3rd in the world, which is the high est finish the US Junior National Squash team has ever accomplished. Former US Figure Skater turned Varsity Water Polo Player, Kyle MacMillan, also joins our new class. New members Ben Clarke and Tom Salama were integral parts of establishing Wawa United, part of a new off-campus soccer league that competes all over central Jersey.

This past year two of our seniors, Miranda Rosen and Jack Finlay, were awarded prestigious scholarships for their academic performance. Miranda was named a Truman Scholar, The award provides funding toward graduate school and the opportunity to participate in professional development programs to prepare for careers in public service. Finlay is one of 16 Churchill Scholarship winners who will spend a year studying at the University of Cambridge while living at Churchill College. Temi Aladesuru has been on the board of the Order of Black Male Excellence since his freshman year. The mission of this organization is to improve the experience of black students on campus. Luke Hall has been an active member and officer of Princeton Disability Awareness. As an officer, Luke helped organize and run a carnival on Princeton's campus where disabled children were invited and paired with a Princeton Buddy for a day. While the children attend the carnival, their parents are invited to a conference on disabilities featuring panelists from Princeton's faculty and experts in the field.

The athletic achievements of our current membership are also to be noted. Senior Roan Gideon, as a dual-citizen of the US and Ireland, competed for the Ireland under 19 men's national lacrosse team in 2016 at the FIL (Federation of International Lacrosse) U19 Men's Lacrosse Championships. Roan played midfielder on the team and helped captain the team to a 7th place world ranking. Ireland played against some fantastic international competition and ended with a 4-2 record, unfortunately missing the opportunity to compete against fellow Tiger Inn member Austin Sims, who led Team USA to a world championship.
