A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me." (John 10: 14)

WE ALWAYS SHOULD EMULATE the life and words of Jesus. I find this passage fitting for my first contribution to *Koinonia* because although I have been serving the Lutheran Parish of Northern Dutchess since the Sunday of Labor Day weekend, my presence here has been limited to Sundays only. That all changed on March 26 when the members voted to call me as their pastor. This was a glorious day for me! I have felt a sense of welcome and belonging from the very first Sunday, and although I have had the opportunity to get to know some of the good people from each congregation, I have felt frustrated that in not being able to go further and get to know more people.



Now that is all changed! More than anything, I want to be the good pastor---the good shepherd. I want to be able to say, "I know my sheep and my sheep know me!" Since Call Sunday I have visited numerous home-bound members and have met with many others in the Parish Office at Third in Rhinebeck. I have regular office hours at Memorial on Tuesdays from 1-3, and at St. Paul's on Thursdays from 4-6. I will be establishing office hours at Third beginning the week after Easter, so stay tuned for that.

And please note, that I am available by appointment at times other than these hours. My contact information is on the cover of our worship bulletins: 914-441-4360 circuitpastorjim@aol.com.

Additionally I will be scheduling Bible Study at Third. Please remember that St. Paul's has Bible Study on Thursdays from 6:30-8:00 p.m., which is being led by their Council President, Steve Bucala. I have begun attending these and I highly recommend them. Currently, we are studying Luther's Commentary to Paul's Letter to the Romans. These sessions, as well as those which I will set up at Third, are open to ALL Parish members---AND anyone in the community who is interested. Please pass the word!

I pray that all of you have had a meaningful Lent and Holy Week and that you are rejoicing in the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus. As a Parish, some of the special events coming up which call for celebration are the spaghetti dinner on April 29 at St. Paul's, my ordination on May 20 at Third, Clara's confirmation at St. Paul's on Pentecost, and young Theodore's baptism at Third on June 18.

Please help me as I try to make the words of Jesus my own. I want to get to know you. I want to learn about your lives, your hopes, fears, and dreams. I want us to become more and more aware of the presence of Jesus in our lives so that as a Parish, we can grow and share the love of God with all that we encounter. To do this, I need to hear from you!

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON'S MESSAGE

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!....He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Easter is a time to celebrate our Risen Lord.

During this Easter Season, the Lutheran Parish of Northern Dutchess has something really big to celebrate. It is the Rite of Ordination of our newly Called Pastor, James Miller. The Rite of Ordination and Service of Installation of a Pastor will be Saturday, May 20, 2017, at Third Evangelical Lutheran



Church, Rhinebeck. The Service will begin at 10:30 am. The Rev. Dr. Robert A. Rimbo, Bishop of the Metropolitan New York Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, will preside at the Rite of Ordination. Everyone in the Parish, family, friends and neighbors are invited to join this wonderful Parish celebration. A luncheon reception will follow the service in the Fellowship Hall. During the Lenten Season our Parish collected personal care items: Towels, soap, combs, nail clippers for Lutheran World Relief's Baskets of Promise project. These items will be assembled prior to the Youth Group Spaghetti dinner on April 29. It appears that close to 70 baskets of promise will be assembled.

The first weekend in June will be full of activity. On Saturday, June 3, our Parish will participate in the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life walk. This year's event will be held at Franklin Delano Roosevelt High School, South Cross Road, Hyde Park, N.Y. Different from past years, this will not be an overnight event. The walk will start at 12:00 p.m. with the traditional opening ceremony. All of the usual Relay for Life activities will take place before the event concludes at 10:00 p.m. Please consider walking sometime during the 10 hours; support our Parish participants; purchase a luminary; or make a donation in support of our team. Donations or luminary purchases can be made by contacting one of our team captains: Joanne Plass, Don Campbell, Susan Martin or Linda Woodward. Donations can be made on line by going to the Relay for Life Northern Dutchess website; then locating our team, Lutheran Parish of Northern Dutchess.

On Sunday, June 4, our Parish will join together for one worship service at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Red Hook. The purpose of this service is to celebrate Clara Patton's Confirmation. Worship will begin at 10:00 a.m. Let us all come together to celebrate this important time in Clara's life.

What a joyous time; with many things to celebrate!

While this year's event has a new location, all other elements will remain the same. Relay begins with an opening ceremony, followed by a survivors' lap, a caregivers' lap, and then a luncheon to follow. The luncheon is provided at no cost for survivors and their caregivers. Last year, our Parish filled two tables at the luncheon and our guests were treated to live music and a photo booth to commemorate the day. A silent auction will take place following the luncheon so our guests won't miss out. Luminaries will be placed around the track in support of those battling Cancer and in memory of those we have lost. Our Team: Lutheran Parish of Northern Dutchess, will have participants walking the track throughout the event. This years theme is "Let's have a ball!", so hopefully we can enjoy a little healthy competition with a few sporting events for our relayers to enjoy throughout the day.

I will have a table at the Spaghetti Dinner on April 29th at St. Paul's, on May 20th following the Ordination at Third, and will be available during Council meetings for you to sign up to walk the track, purchase luminaries and join our effort to raise awareness and support those affected by cancer.
