PROGRAM: Our **November Mock Show:** One of our members suggested we try this early in the year so we are going to have a mock show in the regular meeting. The intent is to **show** you what goes on at one of our shows rather than **tell** you what we do.

Members will enter their show and tell plants just as if they were putting them in the society's exhibit



in our January show. They will have a schedule to follow and entry tags to fill out. Glen and Jo Ann will each do an exhibit using the show and tell plants. They will only have 30 minutes to place your plants. As they work Becky Jolly-Wood, our exhibit coordinator, will explain what they are doing. Then we will all judge the plants in the exhibits just like a real show. Robert Stanton will be our head judge and he will be assisted by members serving as head clerk, spotters and ribbon clerks. We'll even have a raffle table manned by Marilyn Ladnier and Marjorie Inmon just like at our shows. Hopefully this will be fun!

Many ordered Maxillaria reichenheimiana pictured at left. Yes, those are spots on the leaves. It is native to Central America and likes medium light and very high humidity. It has a yellow flower in the summer or fall.

SHOW NEWS: Plans for our 2015 show at the Gautier Convention Center are moving forward. Tina Torguson has agreed to Chair the Children's Corner. At left is a photo of the children's activities from

This year we lost Hicks Supplies, Hicks Orchids and Morning Star. We have one new vendor confirmed and by Sunday's meeting, hopefully, we will have more. So far our vendors are Riverbend Orchids, Orchid Retreat, Clown Alley, Orchids Plus and Louisiana Orchid Connection.

We have talked with two vendors who both sell tropical plants besides orchids; hopefully at least one will agree to

come to our show.

bit earlier and take his class. At 11:30 on Sunday morning Jo Ann will lead a hands-on potting class. Both classes are free but if you pot your orchid in the potting class there will be a fee for the supplies.

VOLUNTEERS AND WORKERS FOR THE MOCK SHOW:

Set up: Anyone who gets there around 1:00 PM; help Glen and Jo Ann unload, mark two 5' squares at either end of show and tell table, move two tables just inside the meeting room door for use as a raffle table. Move three tables just outside the meeting room door for plant entry workers.

Raffle: Marilyn Ladnier and Marjorie Inmon; they will sell raffle tickets and ask members to sign in. **Plant table workers:** Janice Fabo will assign alphabetical letters to exhibitors; Jo Ann will supply list. Judy Chinsee will give each plant a number, either a 1 or a 2; Jo Ann will supply labels. Glen and Jo Ann will help members with class codes.



HOW TO FILL OUT AN ENTRY TAG: This is a very simple process. Refer to the photo of an entry tag at left. This is a carbon type form with a top and bottom. Press down hard when you write. After you



complete the tag, give the original to Chip and put the copy on your plant. Wire or tape will be provided for this purpose.

Class number is whatever class your plant fits in. Glen and Jo Ann will help with that. The schedule is attached to this email. Please print it out and bring it to the meeting. We will use it to enter your plants and to follow as we judge the show and tell plants.

Tag number is not used unless you bring in two of the exact same type of plant with the same name; it's used to differentiate between two such plants.

Exhibitor number is the alphabetic number Janice Fabo will give you. It will be the same for all your plants.

Exhibit number is the number that Judy Chinsee puts on your plants; either a 1 or a 2.

Name and cross are the same as what you normally put on our show and tell signup sheet.

During judging our head clerk will circle the ribbons awarded to each plant judged. Later the tags will be studied and all points will be credited to their owners for show and tell points.

We will still do a best plant; Tina will hand out the forms as usual.

WINTER CARE OF YOUR ORCHIDS: By now all your orchids should be in a warm area with the possible exception of Cymbidiums. Do not hesitate. Most orchids can't take long periods below 55 degrees. Signs of low temps are a gradual yellowing of the leaves leading to leaf drop; especially on lower leaves



in Vandas and randomly on Dendrobiums. If you notice these signs check to make sure your heater is working and there are no gas leaks. **Do not increase your watering** as that may cause rot in already stressed plants. Do increase your air circulation and leave your plants alone. Water as you normally do (only on warm, sunny days.) They may heal themselves. Don't throw out plants that have dropped all their leaves. For many plants such as Catasetums (pictured at left) this is to be expected for plants like Vandas and Dendrobiums they may make kiekies along the main stem. **Do not delay, get those plants inside now.**
