Dear Raider Regiment new and returning members and families,

Welcome to the Santa Fe HS Raider Regiment family. Band is truly one of the most rewarding activities in which students can belong. Not only do you learn the musical and technical skills that make you a better musician, you also learn skills that will help you throughout your entire life. It takes hard work, dedication, perseverance, and patience. However, the benefits and rewards of being part of a high school band program will last a lifetime.

Santa Fe High School Raider Regiment is one of the most successful high school marching programs in the state of Florida. Most notably, SFHS is the only school in the state of Florida to make Florida State Marching Band Championship finals each year of FMBC existence. A streak that we look to continue this season. Along with marching band accolades, SFHS routinely receives superior ratings at Florida Band Masters Association Marching and Concert assessment. Along with marching band, and symphonic band, we also have a very successful Winter Guard and Indoor Percussion program.

This handbook will outline both time and financial requirements it takes to be a member of the SFHS Raider Regiment. It will also outline expectations that are required of every member of the band. For the program to succeed, each member must buy in to the idea of the common good of the program. Each member must be held to high standards, expectations, and be accountable for themselves and the team.

SANTA FE HS RAIDER REGIMENT BAND BOOSTERS

The Santa Fe High School Raider Regiment is supported by a parent run organization – SF Raider Regiment Boosters, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. The Boosters exist solely through the efforts of volunteers in order to help provide our students with an enjoyable and rewarding band and guard experience. Please join us in meeting this challenge by volunteering your time and talents. The students will gain the benefits from your hard work and dedication. We welcome all new parents (and grandparents, aunts, uncles...) and look forward to getting to know you and your students!

The purpose of the SF Raider Regiment Boosters is to provide assistance and to serve as an advocate for the band and guard program. MISSION STATEMENT

The SF Raider Regiment provides outstanding musical experiences and opportunities to its students while helping them grow into responsible, mature adults. To make these experiences successful, we require discipline, organization and commitment to the program. Being a part of the band is an honor and students will be expected to help serve as role models for the school and other organizations within it. As a result of our high expectations, discipline, leadership and social opportunities, the students can develop valuable life skills such as a positive self-image, time management skills, confidence, poise, responsibility, and loyalty as well as the musical abilities needed to be a successful musician and performer.

OUR GOALS

- To provide a comprehensive knowledge of music through performance, creation, and promotion of music.
- To provide an environment that promotes and encourages life-long learning and personal/professional growth.
- To create an environment that provides all students with a sense of community and loyalty to an organization bigger than themselves.
- To provide an opportunity for students to develop as disciplined, organized, and mature adults.
- To allow students to express themselves in a different and creative manner through the means of music.
- To reach full potential in all aspects of students' lives using music.

ORGANIZATIONS

“The Raider Regiment” Marching Band operates during the fall semester from June with the start of mini-camp and band camp through November with the end of FMBC Championships. It is comprised of all band students and performances including halftime at all home and some football games, various parades, and marching band contests. It is important to know that marching band is a physical activity and does require a significant time commitment. Students will have afternoon rehearsals as well as a night rehearsal at least one day a week. Students will be required to be early to all rehearsals and performances. The color guard is an extremely important part of the marching band as it greatly adds to its visual and aesthetic appeal to an audience. They hold all the same requirements and responsibilities as any other band member and will serve as part of the band in the spring.

Santa Fe HS Concert Band begins as marching season ends. A rubric will be used to assess each student's proficiency level and determine chair placements. This rubric will be given to the students before they begin so they know how to prepare. Concerts will be held throughout the year to let the parents enjoy the progress and work of the students. We will also perform at MPA music festivals.

Santa Fe HS Jazz Band is another ensemble that we offer. We play at various concerts for the parents throughout the year. Jazz band allows the students to experience a different type of music in which there is more room for creative expression through improvisation. Students will need to audition for this group as well as its membership is limited. The exact number and instrumentation will be determined according to number of students in the concert band.

Santa Fe HS Winter Guard participates in the spring and they will continue to compete at many winter guard FFCC contests and competitions. The students who participate in this must be aware that they are taking on a very serious commitment, as they will be serving in the band as well as the guard. The students will need to put the appropriate amount of practice time and effort into both organizations. This is not a choice but a requirement.

Santa Fe HS Winter Percussion participates in the spring and they will continue to compete at many indoor percussion FFCC & WGI competitions. The students who participate in this must be aware that they are taking on a very serious commitment, as they will be serving in the band as well as the percussion. The students will need to put the appropriate amount of practice time and effort into both organizations. This is not a choice but a requirement.

MEMBER EXPECTATIONS

- ALWAYS BE ON TIME. If you are not early, you are late!
- Present at ALL rehearsals and performances
- Be ON TIME and PREPARED for ALL classes, rehearsals, and performances.
- Responsible for keeping your instrument and equipment in top working condition.
- Be a TEAM PLAYER. Understand that all staff and officers have a role, and job to do. Make sure you are being a positive, proactive member!
- REGULAR INDIVIDUAL PRACTICE!!! You are responsible for your individual practice. In class and at ensemble rehearsal is not the time to practice. You must do that on your own time. 30-45 min. daily is recommended.
- Private lessons. It is recommended that, if possible, you seek private lessons on your individual instrument. This will go a long way to make you better at your craft, and a more well-rounded musician.
- KEEP THE BAND ROOM, CUBBY ROOM, GUARD ROOM and INSTRUMENT ROOM CLEAN!!!!!! While it is important to feel at home in the band room, these facilities are a privilege and not a right. You should only keep things in your cubby or the guard room that you need for band or rehearsals. Food, clothes not needed for rehearsal, water bottles, etc. will not be permitted. The same thing goes for the instrument storage room.
- Keep up with the weekly rehearsal schedule, performance schedule, and any other personal responsibilities to the band program. This also includes rehearsal and commitments during concert band season.
- If you use something or move something.... PUT IT AWAY! This includes music stands, chairs, any percussion hardware or instruments, etc...
- Buy in to the program, and the idea of being part of something bigger than yourself.
- Students must show respect for all band members, directors, and parents. Whether they are part of our organization or part of another organization, it does not matter.
- Students must show respect for all property. Every area the band visits should be left in better condition than it was before they entered it.
- The uniform must be worn correctly at all performances. Students will wear their band shirts underneath their uniform jackets and all jackets and pants are always to be fully buttoned and zipped. The uniform will be worn correctly or not at all.
- No food or drinks will be allowed at any rehearsal or performance. This includes gum on the marching field and food or drinks in the stands. The only exception is water or sports drinks provided for hydration.
- Being in band is a privilege. Only band members will be allowed to sit with the band at any rehearsals or performances, including times that we perform in the stands.
- Proper language is to be used at all times!
- Public Display of Affection is not for rehearsal or for the band room. PDA will not be tolerated at any time.
- Band should be fun! Remember, the more effort you put into the program and making every rehearsal successful, the more fun and worthwhile your experiences become.

WE HAVE A NO BULLYING POLICY

The Santa Fe high school Raider regiment does not tolerate bullying at any time. Bullying will be reported to the resource officer and the school administration. For further information see the school handbook specifically discussing this topic. Students and parents, please treat others how you would want to be treated and speak with kindness no matter what location we are in. At the end of the day we are all representing the Raider Regiment. You can't put the toothpaste back in the tube!

RULES, ATTENDANCE POLICIES, GRADING POLICIES

Basic Rules

The band has only three basic rules:

1. Be on time and in the right place.
2. Give 100% with a great attitude.
3. Treat others the way you want to be treated.

Everything else falls into one of these categories.

- Students must abide by all policies set forth by the School Board of Alachua County, Santa Fe High School and the SFHS Raider Regiment. You represent every one of these entities every time you perform, rehearse or travel. Take pride in that fact.
- No Gum in rehearsal, EVER!!!
- For marching rehearsals, you must be in the rehearsal uniform. The uniform is a white T-Shirt (grey t-shirt color guard), black athletic shorts (no volleyball shorts), sneakers, and socks. Students not in uniform will be required to leave rehearsal until they are in uniform and it will count as an unexcused absence.
- Cell Phones may not be used during a rehearsal or performance. Students who violate this policy will have their phone taken and returned at the end of the rehearsal or event and will include a parent conference. A second violation will result in a Discipline Referral.
- Profanity will not be tolerated at any time. Students may receive a discipline referral for use of profane language in class or at an event outside of the school day.

Drug and Alcohol Policy

The Santa Fe High School Raider Regiment will have a ZERO TOLERANCE drug and alcohol policy. Any student who is caught with possession or under the influence of drugs (including vaping) and/or alcohol at a band function, at SFHS, by a Law Enforcement Officer or any other individual of authority (Parent, Clergy, etc) will be subject to any and all SFHS and/or Public Law Enforcement consequences. If a student is caught by any of these entities, a mandatory meeting with the SFHS Principal, Band Directors, Deans and Law Enforcement will be held to discuss further participation in the band or dismissal from the program. Remember, the Santa Fe High School Raider Regiment is a privilege, and students must maintain the highest standards to remain a member.

Attendance

Attendance (including after school) is mandatory for all members of the Raider Regiment as set by the calendar. We expect 100% attendance at every rehearsal and performance. As a member, you occupy an important part in space in each band event. Even one person missing at a rehearsal or performance greatly affects the rest of the group. Attendance at all rehearsals, games, competitions, MPA's, community events, etc. is essential for the overall success of the band.

Procedure for Absence

Of course, sickness and other hardships will make it necessary to miss on a rare occasion. The parent must notify the director in writing (via a signed note or email) as far in advance as possible. Texting, telling a friend, or telling a staff member is NOT sufficient. Please fill out the form on the website if you or your child will be absent.

Messages will be put into one of three categories by the director.

1. Permitted: Advance notice given and the reason given needs to be a SFHS sanctioned event. However, if we have a performance on the day of the event, you are expected to be at our performance. A permitted absence will not require any make up assignment.
2. Excused: Advanced notice is given to the director. Reasons include a family emergency or illness only. Doctors' appointments, drivers' tests and vacations are not considered excused. Students will need to do a makeup assignment for a missed performance or perform a makeup task for a missed rehearsal. Points will only be awarded once the makeup assignment or task has been completed.
3. Unexcused: No notice given for any reasons, including illness or family emergency. Make up assignments or tasks will not be accepted. Work is not an excused absence.

Consequences for Unexcused Absences

- Any unexcused missed rehearsal will result in 0 for that rehearsal. This includes marching, symphonic, concert bands as well as Indoor Guard and Indoor Percussion.
- An unexcused absence from a rehearsal during Marching Band may result in being benched from that week's performance which would also result in a loss of performance points.
- An unexcused missed performance will result in a 0 for that performance which will lower the student's 9 weeks grade significantly.

Making up Excused Absences

- To make up an Excused Performance, a student will need to complete a performance-based project of the director's choice. The due date will be set when the need arises.

Tardies

- Excused tardies will not result in any penalty, but the student and director must agree on a time of arrival to the rehearsal or performance. Excused tardies include participation in other sports practices, study sessions, and any other school related reasons.
- Unexcused Tardies will result in the loss of 10 participation points for each infraction. You are late if you are not where you are supposed to be, prepared and ready to go, at the announced time of the rehearsal.

Please understand that your lack of planning affects everyone in the band. Excuses like "I forgot," "I could not get a ride," "I had to work," and "I had homework" are all displays of lack of planning. These become very irritating to the students around you and can also lead to your dismissal from the program.

Grading Policy

By its general nature, it's all about "showing up." With that in mind, the grading policy will be as follows:

- **Performances 35%**
- **Playing assessments 25%**
- **Rehearsal 20%**
- **Being prepared 20%**

Instruments / Equipment

Instrument / Equipment Maintenance

1. We know that money is tight, but students will perform better on a better instrument or equipment. Please make every effort to own or rent at least an intermediate level instrument and mouthpiece or equipment. **Before purchasing an instrument or equipment please consult with the band director before doing so to ensure making a good purchase!**
2. Woodwind instruments should be swabbed every day. Students must have at least 3 Vandoren reeds always.
3. Brass players need to polish their instrument and clean tuning slides at least once per week. The instrument should receive a bath no less than once per month.
4. School instruments must be cared for in the most careful way and students will be held responsible for negligent damage to a school owned instrument. Rental fees will be \$50.00 per semester per instrument. Rental fee is due at the beginning of the semester in which the instrument is being used. This applies to percussion and Colorguard as well.
5. Personal Instruments will not be cared for, maintained, nor replaced if there is an accident or something is wrong with your instrument. You will need to do this by taking your instrument to a few reputable places in Gainesville. We would suggest Hoggtowne Music or Great Southern Music.

6. Percussionists need to own a stick bag with one pair of Concert Snare Drumsticks (Vic Firth SD1 or comparable), one pair of General Timpani Mallets, and one pair of yarn marimba mallets.
7. Color Guard equipment must be properly taped and have names places on every one of their equipment.

Necessary Instrument / Equipment Accessories

These supplies should be purchased as soon as financially possible. They will greatly improve your sound and make playing easier!

- Flute: Cleaning/tuning rod & cotton swab
- Clarinet: Rico Plastic Coated Reeds (at least size 3) (Vandoren for symphonic band), Rovner Dark ligature, Pad cleaning paper, Cork Grease, and Vandoren B45 Mouthpiece Preferred- Vandoren mouthpiece
- Saxophone: Rico Plastic Coated Reeds (at least size 3) (Vandoren for symphonic band), Neotech neck strap, Cork Grease Preferred- Selmer C* mouthpiece
- Trumpet: Valve Oil, Slide Grease, Silver Polish, Lint-Free cloth Bach 3C or 1C mouthpiece (7C is too small)
- Mellophone: Valve Oil, Slide Grease, Silver Polish, Lint-Free cloth Conn Mellophone 6 Mouthpiece
- Horn- Rotor Oil, Slide Grease, Farkas MDC Mouthpiece
- Trombone/Baritone: Valve Oil, Slide Grease, Silver Polish, Lint-Free cloth Bach 6 ½ AL Mouthpiece
- Tuba: Valve Oil, Slide Grease, Silver Polish, Lint-Free cloth Helleberg 7C Mouthpiece
- Percussion- Listed above
- Guard - Black Tape, White Tape (and sometimes special colored tap)

**Other mouthpieces may work better for you; these are just a suggestion. Please consult the band director or a private teacher before purchasing something different.

 - Saturday's as scheduled on the calendar
- Winter Guard

Tuesday Study Sessions: Since marching band takes up many hours, every effort should also be made for continued excellence in all academic classes. To assist with academic success, all band and guard members who are not going home after school are required to stay after school on Tuesdays and study, read, or do homework in the band room

between the end of the school day and the beginning of marching practice. Students can bring food to eat or have food dropped off for them at 4:00pm.

Dismissal/End of Practice: Rehearsal is over only after the band and guard is dismissed. The band and guard need to rehearse the total number of scheduled hours per week. If you do your part by arriving and setting up on time, we will dismiss you 15 minutes before the scheduled end of rehearsal. Student's are required to help ALL members bring back and put away equipment. We start as a team and we end as a team! Parents and family are welcomed to help out with this process.

Student Pick-up: School policy is that supervision of students ends 30 minutes after dismissal. This goes for rehearsals as well as coming back from performances. When we return from a trip, students are told to call home 20 minutes before we arrive at the school. There are plenty of cell phones to share. As a last resort, if no parent/guardian can be reached, the Alachua County Sheriff Department will be called to drive the student home.

BAND CAMP

Band camp is a fun and important time for each individual and the band. Attendance is required to participate in marching band because this is the time when we begin to learn our marching show. Many instructional staff and well-known experts are brought in to assist with instruction during the camp. Be sure you acclimate yourself to the heat and attend summer practices to prepare your body for the hard work at camp! Band camp is very hard work but is very fun as well! There are many fun activities that will get you ready for the next school year. Camp dates and times are:

Mini-Camp: Monday, June 3rd – Wednesday, June 5th 9:00am – 5:00pm

Band Camp: Monday, July 22nd – Friday, July 26th 9:00am – 5:00pm

Monday, July 29th – Friday, August 2nd 9:00am – 5:00pm

SOUTHERN SHOWCASE OF CHAMPIONS

The southern showcase of champions is a marching band competition put on by the Santa Fe high school Raider Regiment and band boosters. This event is an FMBC sanctioned event that has been going on since 1995. This event helps us fund part of our season and is needed to offset the fees for each member. A lot of planning, preparations, and volunteering is needed to put this event in place. Each member and a family member are required to work the three-day event. The date for this event is listed on the Santa Fe high school Raider Regiment calendar.

Day 1: Setup | Day 2: Competition | Day 3: Cleanup

PRIVATE LESSONS, HONOR BANDS, AND SOLO AND ENSEMBLE

- **Private Lessons:** All members are encouraged to seek private lessons on their instruments. Private lessons will only increase the individual's musicianship, thus benefiting the band overall. Please, if you are interested in taking private lessons, talk with the director or staff about suggestions for private lesson teachers on your instrument.
- **Solo and Ensemble:** All members are encouraged to participate in Solo and Ensemble. Participation in Solo and Ensemble is vital in member's growth as a performer and musician. Students who receive a Superior Rating on a Grade 5 or higher piece at District Solo and Ensemble are eligible to move on to the state level.
- **Alachua County High School Honor Band:** All students are encouraged to audition for the Alachua County High School Honor Band. Part of being a musician is going through the audition process. It only gets easier the more you do it. If selected to the ensemble, it is an honor to be able to represent the Santa Fe High School Raider Regiment amongst the best musicians in the county.
- **All State Bands:** All Students are encouraged to audition for the All State Bands. Auditions are in September, and the audition materials will be posted. If selected, the concert is in January during the annual Florida Music Educators Association Conference in Tampa.

- If you or your child is auditioning for All State, they will be given priority when it is time to select a member to perform with the honor band at FMEA.

UNIFORMS

- **Marching Band:** All Band member will wear a Uniform top specifically designed for the theme of the show. Color Guard will also wear a specifically designed uniform, based on the theme of the show. The cost of the uniform is included in the fair share. Members **will not** be able to keep their uniform at the end of the season.
- **Symphonic Band:** The band owns a complete set of concert formal wear for both males and females. Students will be fitted for concert attire during concert season. Students will also need to have their own “concert blacks.” This is simply a pair of black slacks, black button up shirt, and black shoes for males. A black dress or a black pair of slacks and a black blouse (ankle length) for females. This outfit is worn for performances where it is not necessary to be in formal attire.
- **Winter Color Guard & Percussion:** All members will receive a uniform for their indoor show. These will be specifically designed to reflect the theme of their shows. The cost of the uniform is included in the fair share. Members will not be able to keep their uniform at the end of the season.

FAIR SHARE AND FUND RAISING

Fair Share: As with any top tier organization, it is not without cost. So that we continue to provide each student with the best quality instruction, performance opportunities, and competitive success, fair share for the 2019-2020 marching & symphonic band school year will be \$850 for all members. Indoor Color Guard and Percussion will have separate fees for their respective seasons. Fair Share covers the costs of regular season staff, band camp staff, clinicians, show tops and costumes, costume cleaning, drill, choreography, music arrangements, props, equipment needed for marching band, instrument repairs, travel and hotel for FMBC Championships, and any other costs that is accrued by the program.

Payment Schedule is as follows:

- Payment 1: \$170, due by June 15th
- Payment 2: \$170, due by July 15th
- Payment 3: \$170, due by August 15th
- Payment 4: \$170, due by September 15th
- Payment 5: \$170, due by October 15th

New members will also be required to purchase the following items. Payment for these items are due upon delivery and IS NOT INCLUDED IN THE FAIR SHARE AMOUNT.

- MTX Marching Shoes (Percussion, Winds, Brass) – 50.00
- Brass/Wood Wind Gloves (WW and Brass only. Returning member need to purchase these too.) – 5.00
- Guard Shoes (Guard Only) – 40.00
- Guard Gloves (Guard Only) – 35.00

Paying Your Fair Share: Charms Office Assistant is the Santa Fe Band Booster’s administrative website tool used to manage your student’s contact and financial information. Once in Charms Office Assistant, you can update your student’s information, including email contacts, and view your students’ financial information. To do this, you’ll need a Charms student ID number which your student was assigned upon registration. If you or your student did not receive an ID number or if you have any questions regarding Charms, please contact CHARMS Coordinator: sfband.charms@gmail.com.

The school code is: SFRRMusic

The Student Password is the same as the student ID number until you change it.

Payments in the Dropbox: The mounted Dropbox is where checks and money orders can be turned in throughout the week. NO CASH please! If you need to pay with cash, go to the front office and get a receipt for the cash to turn into the Dropbox. Cash payments will not be accepted. ALL CHECKS need to have the students name in the memo section!

1. Use an envelope to place the check, receipt, or money order in
2. Seal the envelope and list:
 - a. Students name
 - b. What the money's for
 - c. Any other important info needed
3. Then place in the mounted Dropbox

FUNDRAISING:

SFHS Raider Regiment is fortunate to be able to have several fundraisers that allow students and families to fund raise more than enough to cover the fair share costs. While it takes time, and more is made if the student can get more family or friends to participate, it is possible to raise well over the \$700. While there are fundraisers that are in the works, and more information regarding those will be given as soon as possible, here are some of the fundraisers that are available for all members to participate in.

- Chair Back Install and Take Down at UF Football Stadium (August – Dec.)
- Chair Back Rentals during UF Home Football Games (Sept. – Nov.)
- Working Gator Shop during UF Home Football Games (Sept. – Nov.)
- Parking Cars at Gator Nationals (March)
