Fire Protection Updates - attached you will find a number of related correspondence highlighting recent discussion about the transition to our new Fire Services Providers, effective January 1st, 2015. You will note the June 21st, 2015 letter from Lac Ste. Anne County where our decision to terminate our fire protection agreements with the county are recognized by County Council and where our request to enter into mutual aid agreements under the new Fire Protection framework are declined by County Council. The is also a note from County Manager Mike Primeau clarifying a section of the June 21st, 2015 letter; the closing sentence references the County's withdrawal from all existing fire service agreement discussions and contracts, not all municipal agreements between the County and the Summer Village of South View. You will find ads from North West Fire and Rescue and Lac Ste Anne County published in local papers and publicizing the new framework and transition into a new fire services agreement.
