In 2016 there is a unique cosmic occurrence that repeats 4 times in almost exact intervals for the year. It involves a stellar eclipse of Aldebaran with the Moon. Aldebaran is the fiery red eye of Taurus. These Moon eclipsing Aldebaran will only be visible in North America, as if to denote America, the U.S. in particular. In the occult, Aldebaran is considered the motif for the All-Seeing of Lucifer as the 2 horns of Taurus construe a 'pyramid' when the constellation is depicted right upside. The Ecliptic passes directly inbetween the horns and thus the Sun passes at this point around the time of Pentecost for reference. The planets also pass below or above this line. What is unique is that in some cases the retrograde of some planets occur at this precise juncture as it was the case for Venus in 2012.

Jan 19: A waxing gibbous Moon Apr 09: A waxing gibbous Moon Jul 29: A waning gibbous Moon Oct 19: A waning gibbous moon

The following are the various Feasts of YHVH for 2016. One peculiar observation about the Feasts concerns Hanukah. If a 40-day interval is taken from the Hanukah of December 7, 2015, then the 7th interval of time will be on September 11, 2016 or a 9-11.

The following are the 7 main Feasts of YHVH plus the secondary Feasts that are celebrated before and after. In another observation, in 2016, Purim will coincide with a Penumbral Lunar eclipse. Another very interesting repeat of Sukkot 2015 is that as it was on a Supermoon, so the Sukkot or Feast of Tabernacles will commence with a Supermoon. The last time the Moon was this close to the Earth was in January of 1948, the year Israel became a nation.

4 Shavuot

Begins sunset of Saturday, June 11, 2016 Ends nightfall of Monday, June 13, 2016

5 Rosh Hashanah

Begins sunset of Sunday, October 2, 2016 Ends nightfall of Tuesday, October 4, 2016

6 Yom Kippur

Begins sunset of Tuesday, October 11, 2016 (Mercury-Jupiter in Virgo) Ends nightfall of Wednesday, October 12, 2016

7 Sukkot

Begins sunset of Sunday, October 16, 2016 (Supermoon) Ends nightfall of Sunday, October 23, 2016

8 Shemini Atzeret & Simchat Torah

Begins sunset of Sunday, October 23, 2016 Ends nightfall of Tuesday, October 25, 2016

9 Chanukah

Begins sunset of Saturday, December 24, 2016 Ends nightfall of Sunday, January 1, 2017
