E. Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office

- By chance, we had 2 ACSO Deputys present: <u>Dennis Meyer</u> and <u>Michael Knight</u>.
- They are the Community Resurce Specialists for Centennial. Their main job is crime prevention through environmental design. They spoke to us about a few safety programs in which the ACSO is involved.
- The new Neighborhood Watch program, <u>Dog Walker Watch</u>, involves folks walking dogs
- ID theft is one of the biggest problems so far this year; property crimes are level.
- Home security survey: to schedule a home security walk-through, focused on neglected security matters, call 720-874-3750.
- The federal website to report online crimes is ic3.gov.
- The ACSO has installed FLOCK license plate readers in 4 locations in Centennial to catch stolen cars. Every reported stolen car is in the system.
- F. Arapahoe County, Daniela Villareal, Management Analyst, Commissioners' Office
 - The Board of County Commssioners voted to refer County deBrucing to the Nov. ballot.
 - The final bit of County Line Rd. widening should start by the end of the year.
- G. City of Centennial, Council member District 4, Don Sheehan
 - On 9/21, the ACSO will have an Open House & Pancake Breakfast, 8am-(Sheehan didn't give the timing, neither does the Sheriff's website).
 - Vanessa Gates, who was the Homelessness Coordinator for the City & County, is working only for the city, now. Folks can do a ride along with her.

- Mapping technology is on the on the City's website, search for <u>Maps & Open Data</u>. It shows zoning, street sweeping, snow plowing priorities, permits, special districts, HOAs, street rehab projects, Council Districts, development plans. (*Andrea: I just went to the website & was blown away by the amount of information!*)
- Property taxes have an impact on city & special district revenues.
- Gov.'s bill, HB1001, passed today. There will be press release as of 6:30 tonight.
- DeKovend Park, Shakespeare in the Wild (I couldn't find any information about this.)
- 9/14, Chalk Art Festival @ Streets at SouthGlenn, 10a-4p.
- Walmart had a grand reopening on 8/30, 9a. It's almost like a new store.
- Sept. is National Service Dog Month. They were honored by a proclamation at a City Council meeting.
- On 9/6, Wings of Hope had a fund raising dinner for pancreatic cancer. It was held at Wings over the Rockies.
- Centennial is now into budget season and will hold a budget study session on 9/10, 6-?, at the Public Works building, 7272 S. Eagle St., 80112.
- The City is in the process of buying our street lights (not traffic signals, they're already ours) from Xcel. The largest part of the City is served by Xcel. There followed a brief discusson on this.

 - Michael Gradis had a great PowerPoint program on cell towers and the City's rules with examples of all.
