The Gift of **Hospitality**

Description: It's about practicing **servanthood** right in the middle of your practical Christianity. When we open our **hearts** to others, open our **hands** to serve, and our **homes** for God's purposes we're practicing Christian hospitality.

Example of Faith: **Abraham**

Passage: Hebrews 11:8

11 "By faith Abraham, when he was called, obeyed by going out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance; and he went out, not knowing where he was going."

Notes: Abraham was the known as father of faith because he was able to trust and believe in what God said in such a way that no matter the circumstance he was in able to trust God and have faith.

Example of Hospitality: **Peter's Mother-in-law**

Passage: **Mark 1: 29-33**

29 As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. **30** Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. **31** He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. **32** That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. **33** And the whole city was gathered around the door.

Notes: Peter and Andrew brothers shared a home in either capernum or bethesda. It is thought that after Peter's mother was widowed they brought her into their house to live with them. Now this is their last stop of the day, the average person living in ancient times walked 18-20 miles per day. So Jesus and the disciples show up they are probably tired and hungry. This is where this passage takes place.

The Gift of **Prophecy**

The Gift of **Leadership**

Description: Leaders are **visionaries**. Leaders **delegate** tasks and details to others to accomplish the greater goal. Leaders provide **examples** of how we should order our lives to honor and glorify God.

Example of Prophecy: **Jeremiah**

Passage: **Jeremiah 1: 6 & 13-14**, "6 Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy." **7** But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a boy'; for you shall go to all to whom I send you, and you shall speak whatever I command you. (...) **13** The word of the Lord came to me a second time, saying, "What do you see?" And I said, "I see a boiling pot, tilted away from the north." **14** Then the Lord said to me: Out of the north disaster shall break out on all the inhabitants of the land."

Notes: This kid was a teenager when God called him to be a prophet. At the oldest he was 14, because he responds to God saying I am a child and in Jewish culture you wouldn't say that for a male above the age of 14. He wasn't even old enough to drive, but God decided to use him. God did not care about his age, he cared about his heart and he called him into service and began to speak to him.

Example of Leadership: **Nehemiah**

Passage: Nehemiah 2: 4-6, "4 Then the king said to me, "What do you request?" So I prayed to the God of heaven. **5** Then I said to the king, "If it pleases the king, and if your servant has found favor with you, I ask that you send me to Judah, to the city of my ancestors' graves, so that I may rebuild it." **6** The king said to me (the queen also was sitting beside him), "How long will you be gone, and when will you return?" So it pleased the king to send me, and I set him a date."

Notes: Learning that the remnant in Judah were in distress and that the walls of Jerusalem were broken down, he asked the king for permission to return and rebuild the city. Artaxerxes sent him to Judah as governor of the province with a mission to rebuild
