DESCRIPTION: Great looking and performing high-end Pearson short hunting bow. Comfortable grip. Zebrawood riser. New calf hair shelf rest and side plate. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Beveled arrow shelf. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks; one 2" scratch in the face just above the sight window (see pic on last page). A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is in good shape. Overall, this is a really nice bow in excellent condition for its age.

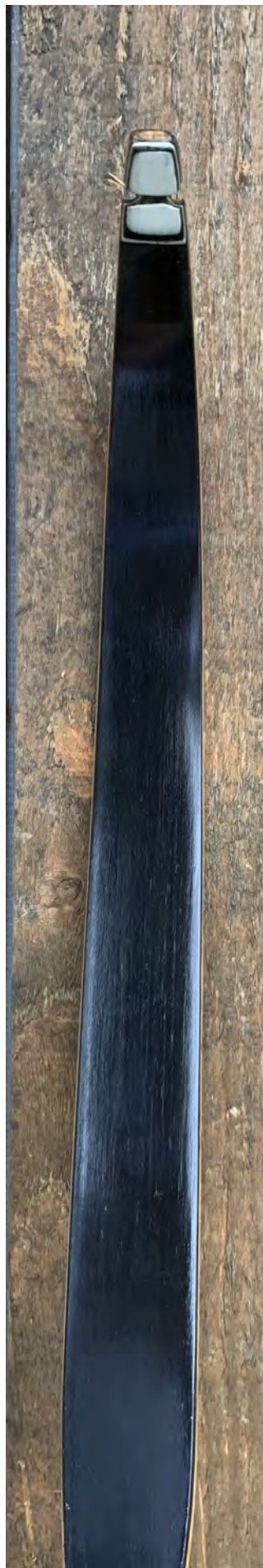
Over the years, I have owned and shot several H-52's, Browning Cobras, and Bear Kodiak Magnums. Overall, the BP H-52 is my favorite of the three.

NOTE: I put this bow to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours) to make sure the old glues would hold and no stress cracks developed). Passed test with no issues.
