














From Behind the Artist's Camera Lens

by Priscilla Bonilla Community contributor Bepa roughly translated means faith. Faith is what defines Michele Geiser, proud owner and founder of Bepa Studio Nature Photography & Unique Art, and her artwork.

Geiser was born and raised in Northeastern Pennsylvania and currently resides in the Shavertown area. Growing up, she has always seen life through the lens of her camera. As a child she always had her hands tied up in all kinds of artistic projects. "I love to create and most importantly share my creations," said Geiser.

Both her parents were artistic and creative. Thinking outside of the box is a lifestyle she grew up in, and is something that comes naturally to her. Her photography primarily focuses on nature with some architectural pieces. The passion and love she has for her artwork comes from within, and is clearly seen when she describes her artwork. "Every piece is unique," said Anthony Bartoli, Wilkes University student who is familiar with Geiser's work. "Another thing that is so striking about Michele and her work is her extraordinary passion which she shows in every photograph."

Geiser's passion was apparent when she explained her artwork: "Desiring to preserve life's moments that slip away never to exist again is part of who I am," Geiser said. "Photography gives me the opportunity to allow these moments to survive endlessly."

Bepa Studio opened in October of 2012 and recently celebrating its one-year anniversary. Geiser's artwork has been recognized by the U.S. National Weather Service in Binghamton, NY; ABC News Affiliate WNEP-TV; the Office of the President of Wilkes University in Wilkes-Barre; and by Cameras for a Cure.

Geiser also contributed some of her pieces to Embrace a Child in Tanzania, Scranton First Friday Art Charity Auction, AFA Gallery and Scranton Prep High School. She was also personally selected by Healing Photo Art Organization to donate her artwork to the organization. These organizations and exhibits, as well as future galleries, that will exhibit her work can be found on Bepa Studio's website, bepastudio.com.

Geiser is a member of the World Photography Organization, the AFA Gallery of Pennsylvania, Arts and Hearts International and is featured on Houzz.

"Michele not only captures some of the most beautiful local images and scenes I have ever seen, but she truly captures the essence of each of her subjects, and why they are the way they are," said Bartoli.

Dr. Jane Elmes-Crahall, professor of communication studies at Wilkes University owns several of Geiser's photographs. "I am especially moved by the artistic perspective she brings to the natural life of Northeastern Pennsylvania. Her artwork is a precious gift. Bepa's website gallery is a showcase for the natural beauty of this region," said Crahall.

Since her childhood, Geiser remembers creating leaf piles and then reorganizing the leaves into different designs. She continues to demonstrate her love for nature and God's creations through her artwork. She has grown to appreciate the beautiful seasons, and learned that with seasons comes change. Her goal is to capture these moments before they disappear forever. "Creativity allows me to breathe, if I can't create I feel smothered," said Geiser.


looking for something specific, you can contact her for more photos. Specific nature shoots can be made by appointment.
