WORSHIP AND PRAYER

Everyday Stewardship:

Some conversion stories people tell are so profound and meaningful. Some of us have these type of stories to tell, but most of us can only tell stories of slowly coming into a greater maturity of faith over many years and many mistakes. I have sinned quite often throughout my years, but I never drifted so far away where I needed that moment of truth to help me see the light.

However, that does not diminish the fact that I have been made new in Christ and I need to live in a way that leaves the old me behind. There are times when we fall into our sin to the point where no one would believe we were baptized disciples of Jesus. Thank God there is forgiveness through the sacraments. When we fall, we can always recover and be made new again.

So maybe it is not true that people like me don't have a profound conversion story. Maybe the truth is we simply have MANY conversion stories. As we continually strive to pick up our crosses and follow Him, we fall away and need to come back to Him. Each time, we have a new story. Each time, God's love and healing are profound.

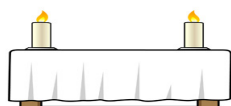

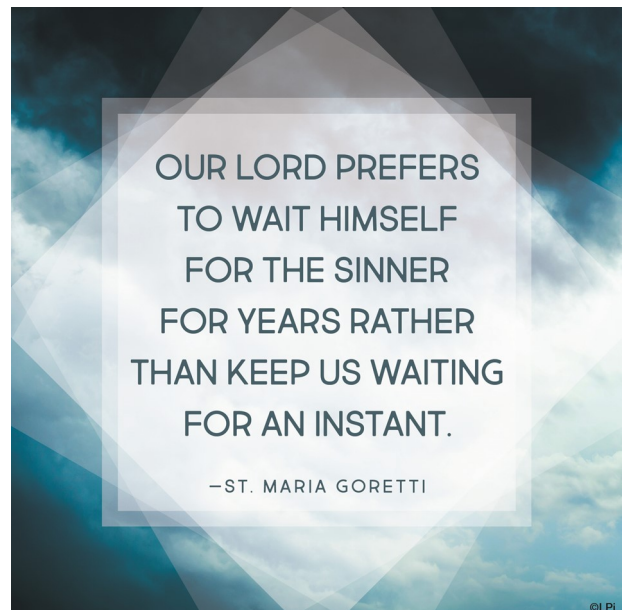

We are now in the second season of Ordinary Time on the Church Calendar. The first season extends from the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord until Ash Wednesday. This second season starts the Monday after Pentecost and runs to the first Sunday of Advent, making it the longest season of the liturgical year. We notice that the color of the priest's vestments change to green, and our music perhaps becomes more familiar and maybe even repetitive. Green is the color of hope and growth. It is often in the "ordinary" times, the dull and mundane times, that the most important growth takes place. This growth is often slow and may even go unnoticed, but the Church in her wisdom gives us this time to reflect on the whole of our Faith and to grow quietly in holiness. So let's take this 'ordinary time' and allow God to do something extraordinary in us.
