Lighting for Digital Photography Saturday August 19, 2017 at 10:00 AM until 1:00 PM

at the Austin Yarborough Public Library Branch, 2200 Hancock Dr., Austin, TX, 78756

Digital still photographers need quality light to produce quality images. If the existing light is not of a sufficient quality, artificial light and/or light modifiers must be employed. The experienced photographer will control several characteristics of the light on the set, including the Quantity, Quality, Color, Direction and Shape of the light.

ASC President Brian Loflin will bring this presentation as an explanation of many of the tools, accessories and materials of lighting, including a discussion and demonstration of their use. Cameras will not be required as this is not a photo session, per se, However, photos of the equipment may be made, if desired.

Brian is a highly-qualified commercial and advertising photographer with more than five decades of experience under his belt, shooting for some of the world's largest corporations and international publications. Today, though actually retired, he continues to serve the aviation and medical industry and spends his time producing images of Texas natural science for books and other publications as well as teaching photography and sharing his passion with others.

May 19-21 • September 28-October 1, 2017
