III. Secretary's Report (Jeanine Stables)

- a. February minutes were reviewed for accuracy and discussion. Motion to accept the minutes as written, Theresa Mosey. Seconded, Dawn Personte. Minutes approved

IV. President's Report (John Mannion)

- a. Cabinet elections tentatively set for June 14th. Sometime in April, an email will go out to members and let them know people can run. We need a nomination committee to be held at the May meeting date. Anyone who wants to run must be presented at this meeting.
Nominating committee will need to be appointed in April
Board of ed. elections are quickly approaching. 3 positions are up for elections this year and at least one doesn't plan to run.
- b. Calendar- we did not get any of the changes we pushed for due to restrictions with number of days. Parent Conferences will take place on 12/14 and 15. Seemingly random 1/2days are due to BOCES calendar
- c. Learner's Edge- backstory. People took a lot of courses over a very short period of time. Dr. Brown and John met to discuss. Now we move forward. Choices- arbitration, but we do have concerns about the rigor of these courses. We may want to consider agreeing to the three course limit for course offered from Augustana. Course must be tied to members teaching or/and strategic planning. Other options available for courses including NYSUT. Also wondering if we can expand the course offerings for the teaching center.
- d. SLC- concerns about trying to limit the number for extras before state tests. He feels we try to do that, and that we can seek out principals.
- e. RA is in April will be before our next cabinet meeting. New NYSUT leaders are up for election.
- f. April 29 is Highway clean-up day

V. Treasurer's Report (Mary Gotham)

- a. Financial update- checking \$115,357 we never got the NYSUT bill for dues this month which is why it's so high.
