Pharmacology researcher wins top award in UT Southwestern art show

Loraine Dieckmann, postdoctoral researcher in pharmacology, won the Best of Show Award in the second annual On My Own Time Art Show on Aug. 21. Dieckmann won with her sculpture "Getting it Out."
