Welcome and Call to Order

The meeting of Sherway Homeowner's Recreation Association was called to order in person at 7:00p.m. on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, chaired by Jamie Pugh, President. Jamie presents our Land Acknowledgment.

Notice of Quorum

The Chairman reported sufficient notice of the meeting had been given and that a quorum was present. Attendance was approximately 47 people.

Approval of AGM Agenda

A motion was put forth for the approval of the AGM agenda and was unanimously approved.

Ward One Council Update / Community Q & A

Jamie introduces Councillor Stephen Dasko of Ward 1, Mississauga. Councillor Dasko discusses several issues, such as:

- The traffic calming lines painted on the roads in the community.
- Carmen Corbasson Community Centre is going through a significant upgrade. The centre closed down for renovations in September 2022 and is expected to reopen in 2024. A new swimming pool and fitness centre will be constructed along with the city's largest warm water therapy pool.
- Port Credit Library was structurally unsound and is being renovated.
- Indigenous Arts Walk has commenced and the first carved piece is displayed at Lakeshore/Hurontario.
- Classic Car Thursdays in Port Credit just finished its third year. This event helps promote local businesses.

- New street signs were installed in the community, as well as new stop signs in several areas.
- Middle Road Bridge was restored, there was a ribbon cutting for new chess tables in Laughton Heights Park, and the tennis, pickleball and basketball courts were resurfaced. Basketball court to also have pickleball lines placed on court.
- Stephen mentions the community skate day event and the community softball games organized by Chris Fiore each year.
- He discusses new developments and Bill 23 that will be passed in December, 2022. New developments will involve building duplexes and triplexes, which is not good for our community due to lack of infrastructure. Intensification is discussed where there are specific plans for Ward 1 The city describes the area's growth and the characteristics of the neighbourhood. These issues are ultimately in the way of them getting 1.5 million homes built.
- Dixie Value Mall development discussions. Developer (Slate and Choice) submitted a plan for adding 3,000-4,000 housing units in this area from 17 up to 40 storey towers. As of now, no plans have been approved for any changes in the Dixie Value Mall location.
- Windrow Program is available, which involves the removal of snow at the base of driveways. This is available for people 65 and older at a cost of \$200 for the season. The program is available for up to 300 participants, on a first come first serve basis.
- The Laughton Heights Park community ice rink is in need of a rink liner. Stephen mentions how sponsors are needed to help cover the cost of the liner. The City does not provide these liners. Going into the pandemic Mississauga had 19 outdoor ice rinks, and now there are 55 rinks.
- Stephen mentions his e-news blast gets sent out to residents to help keep them informed. He is also on a talk show called The Norm Show (9:30am) at the beginning of each month found on radio channel News Talk Sauga 960 AM. There is a virtual senior's coffee talk every Tuesday at 11:00 a.m., which you can find on Stephen Dasko's website.

Community Q & A

- A resident asks about the possibility of putting traffic calming lines or stop signs on Brentano to slow down speeders. Stephen to follow up with the traffic people.
- There is a lack of lighting on Dixie Rd. to Primate Rd. as you turn right off of Sherway Dr. Stephen to follow up.
- Discussions about the lack of lighting on the tennis/pickleball courts. Also, can the lights be left on longer into the evening? Stephen to follow up with the city.
- A resident asks if the slow down signs attached to pylons and placed on the roads can be replaced with something that looks more appealing. Stephen to follow up.
- A resident asks if more lighting can be installed along South Service Rd. beside Dixie Value Mall. Stephen to follow up.

SHORA Election

- Ryan discusses SHORA by-laws. Positions on the Board are for a period of one (1) year. Members of the Board must be re-elected each year.
- No new nominations were received for 2023 for President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary or Past President.
- A motion for a one-year continuance was passed for President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and Past President, and all positions were seconded (none opposed).

- 4 Sherway Upgrades: New/Refreshed park amenities and Middle Road Bridge rehabilitation.
- MTO Construction: MTO has been impacting Sherway for the last 5 years. As the project travels west it will take another 5 years to complete.
- 4 Facebook Groups Established: Sherway Homeowner's, Mom's Group, Pickleball, and Buy & Sell.
- Sherway Residents donated 608 lbs of food and donated \$530 for the Compass Food Bank. This was doubled from our donation to Compass Food Bank from the previous year.
- SHORA's time is focused on getting donations to be able to put on events and draws for the community. In 2022, they received donations from over 30 local vendors. SHORA proudly donated over \$3,000 in prizes to Sherway residents in 2022.
- For the first year of memberships, 34% of Sherway households became members.

- The Brentano field is supposed to change hands from Toronto Zenith to AMICO. All debris and equipment to be removed from area and restored back to its original state. A few trailers will still be left on site.
- No word on any changes for Dixie Value Mall.
- Venta project will now proceed; however, a time is unknown when this will begin.
- Air pollution complaints have been minimal over the last while; however, recent complaints have come in. The Ministry of the Environment was contacted. Mi5 is also working on getting a new piece of equipment installed to reduce air pollution.

Community Q & A

When will the bicycle path under the QEW bridge be opened up?

This is open unofficially as you can still get through. It's possible they have not opened it up completely due to insurance purposes as they are still doing work in this area. Jamie to follow up on a date.

What is happening in the old Samuel building location along Dixie Road?

There will be two large warehouses built in this location; however, it is unknown who has purchased this location.
