The *Spirit Himself* bears witness with our spirit that we are children of *Sod*

Many vain men and women have twisted this scripture to their spiritual detriment. Many have mistaken the voice of their imagination for this witness of the Spirit of God. Then they idly presumed they were children of God while they were doing the work of the devil.

Many reasonable men and women have seen the dreadful effects of this delusion. But in laboring to keep at the utmost distance from it, they have laboring to keep at the utmost distance from it, they have leaned to the opposite extreme and questioned whether the testimony spoken of her is the privilege of of ordinary Christians. They have rather supposed it to be an extraordinary gift that belonged only to the apostolic age.

But we need not run to either one or the other extreme. We may steer a middle course, keeping a sufficient distance from the spirit of error and enthusiasm without denying the gift of God and giving up the great privilege of His children.

The experience of all real Christians shows what many other texts of scripture also reveal. There is, in every believer, both the testimony of God's Spirit, and the testimony of his own spirit, that he or she is a child of God. The testimony of our own spirit is a rational one, but the witness of God's Spirit is a Divine testimony, and intimate conviction manifested to our hearts.


