

#### THE MONTH OF ELUL

The 6<sup>th</sup> month of Elul precedes the "Holy" month Ethanim. Some use this month to prepare their hearts/minds for Yom Kippur. The opportunity is taken to begin introspection/stock taking, reviewing deeds and progress since the last Day of Atonement. It has been the custom of some to repeat the 27<sup>th</sup> Psalms twice daily and read various Psalms each day until Yom Kippur.

#### PSALM 27 An Exuberant Declaration of Faith The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; Of whom shall I be afraid? 2 When the wicked came against me To eat up my flesh, My enemies and foes, They stumbled and fell. 3 Though an army may encamp against me, My heart shall not fear; Though war may rise against me, In this I will be confident. 4 One thing I have desired of the Lord, That will I seek: That I may dwell in the house of the Lord All the days of my life, To behold the beauty of the Lord, And to inquire in His temple. 5 For in the time of trouble He shall hide me in His pavilion; In the secret place of His tabernacle He shall hide me; He shall set me high upon a rock. 6 And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me; Therefore I will offer sacrifices of joy in His tabernacle; I will sing, yes, I will sing praises to the Lord. 7 Hear, O Lord, when I cry with my voice!
