

Living in the Light of Grace and Mercy -----With Pastor Eric

He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise." - Luke 10:37

He saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. – Titus 3:5

In the original Aramaic which Jesus spoke, the word "merciful" means literally "to get under someone's skin." It means to wear his skin, as it were; to see life from his perspective, to stand in his shoes. It means more than sympathy; it means active empathy or merciful understanding.

Bill Bouknight elaborates a bit with the following, "Let me illustrate. A prominent minister was holding a weekend seminar at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina, several years ago. He kept noticing a man in the front row nodding sleepily. This aggravated the speaker. Preachers don't like for folks to go to sleep on them. We don't have that problem here since we armed the ushers with those 36-foot extendable fishing rods so they can tap any nodding worshipper on the head. The speaker at Junaluska thought to himself: Wonder why the man didn't stay home if he couldn't stay awake? During the lunch break, a woman approached the speaker and said, "Sir, let me apologize for my husband's drowsiness. He is undergoing chemotherapy. The doctors have given him a medication to control the side-effects, but it makes him very sleepy. I tried to persuade him to stay home today, but he said, "I must go as long as I'm able. I never know when I will no longer be able to gather with God's people." Suddenly that speaker's attitude toward the drowsy man was transformed. Why? The wife had enabled him to get under the skin of her husband and really understand him. That is the quality of mercy."

Yes...we are entering a new chapter in the evolving COVID-19 pandemic "headache" which I am titling the "DELTA!" I am as tired of this pandemic as anyone else, and I have learned much during the past year. I have learned the importance of patient listening and mercy!! God shows us more than mercy in Jesus Christ. God abides with us every step of this journey with grace. If mercy is about empathy and understanding, then grace is about acceptance, forgiveness, and commitment to love deeply in the face of the merciless.

As we start this new academic year, I hope that each of us will reflect on what it means to show mercy in our daily life and how to recognize mercy when we experience it. Mercy opens the door for fellowship and joy while grace enables you to move through it and grow from it.

Let us pray. Gracious and merciful God may mercy flow into me and your grace abide, so that I might live in peace and joy with you, my neighbor and myself. Grant to us an attitude of gratitude and hope for this new beginning amid a continuing pandemic challenge, in Jesus's name we pray. Amen.



Where the Light Gets In; Losing My Mother Only to Find Her Again by Kimberly Williams Paisley



I enjoyed this book which was written by the actress, Kimberly Williams Paisley, about her mother and her mother's journey with Primary Progressive Aphasia (PPA), a form of dementia that makes one lose their ability to speak. To be more exact, the book was about how the author handled her mother's illness and how she learned to look for the light, the bright moments and opportunities to accept her mother as she was as the disease progressed. I appreciated how the entire family worked together to help Mrs. Williams deal with her illness as well as watching out for each other and making sure everyone was getting the help necessary to accept the harsh realities of the PPA. Although Mrs. Williams was not a practicing Christian, Kimberly is and she leaned on God to help her get through difficult times with her mother. Although she at first felt her father betrayed her ill mother when he got involved with another woman, Kimberly learned to accept that the new woman in her father's life was really a gift in disguise for all of them, as well. I would recommend this book as an inspiration to anyone who is dealing with issues of dementia and caring for those affected by a devastating disease. It is available for check out in the church library.

Where are They Now: Amanda and Mavis

Amanda has lived with her Host Homes mentor, Mavis, for three years and continues to gain more independence through the program. When Amanda first entered Host Homes, she required multiple psychiatric hospital visits throughout the year. She had been living in a busy home with roommates, and she needed a new environment to thrive.

When she moved in with Mavis, the two worked together to build important life skills for Amanda and find ways for her to cultivate her creative mind. Amanda loves listening to Elvis music, sewing, and ceramics, so Mavis helped Amanda enroll in art classes. When she was no longer able to attend during the pandemic, Mavis ensured she had space at home to continue creating art. Amanda recently finished a major ceramics project: a replica of Elvis she has been working on for three years.

Amanda continues to work on her goals, including personal hygiene, exercise, medication management, and cooking. Throughout the pandemic, Mavis and Amanda spent lots of time in the kitchen, and Amanda is now able to cook independently. She loves trying new dishes, and her favorite foods are pasta recipes. And instead of several emergency calls and hospital visits each year, Amanda has not needed mental health hospitalization in more than a year and a half.

"I think I'm doing really well, I've been doing lots of things," Amanda says. "I want to do even more amazing things too. I really like it here."
