
# Ski for Light Returns to Colorado!!

Sat., January 1st was fun. We installed new officers and new members, swapped presidents, and got in a circle to welcome the new members. Then we ate the best open faced sandwiches ever. Next month –How to make them.



Ed Note: Before I received all these great pictures, I had a long story about helping lodges cook lutefisk. Short version: The four Colorado lutefisk and meatball dinners were similar in many ways. Same menus. Each lodge charges about \$20, each fills the dining hall and all serve great food. Each lodge gets their lutefisk from Olsen's in Minneapolis and uses Rosina Swedish meatballs. They all make money and all need more volunteers.

Each lodge does some great things: Lutefisk – Trollheim. The fish is cut into 2 1/2 inch wide pieces, placed in baking trays with screens on the bottom (10 per tray) and salted and peppered. At cooking time melted butter and bacon pieces are generously applied. The lutefisk was done, firm and tasty. Meatballs and Gravy – Stein Fjell – They have a simple but very nice gravy recipe. Potatoes – Fjelldalen - Like most lodges, they peel and boil the potatoes but theirs were really good. Lefse – Fjellheim – Fresh, cut in half with 3 pieces per person. White Sauce – Trollheim – They use bacon grease as the base. Riskrem – All the Colorado lodges make the best riskrem. Lois, Lise and Donna are heroes. Service – Fjellheim – Family style service at round tables. Host with the Most – Stein Fjell -About 380 diners. Magic – Fjelldalen – Small kitchen, one sink, and no warming ovens. 
