## PROPERTY TAXES

Property taxes will be mailed around the first of October. There are some differences worth mentioning. For those who pay their property taxes within 30 days (of postmark) will receive a 2% discount. Property taxes are due by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017 to avoid a penalty of 20% and interest of 6%. After January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018 a \$75.00 collection fee will be added.

The City is striving for 100% collection of property taxes.

City taxes help to pay for beautification and maintenance of city grounds and property.

## RURAL DEVELOPMENT

The city is excited about working with the United States Department of Agriculture to offer affordable home loans for various reasons.

**Rural Home Loans** assists low and very low income applicants obtain decent, safe, and sanitary housing in eligible rural areas by providing payment assistance to increase an applicant's repayment ability.

## **Single Family Repair Loans and Grants**

provides loans to very low income homeowners to repair, improve, and modernize their home or provides grants to elderly very-low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards.

**Rural Home Loans** (partnership with City of Earlington) assists low income applicants to obtain decent, safe, and sanitary housing in eligible rural areas to those who can furnish a modest housing site.

## BURNING

The City is still receiving complaints regarding burning of household trash & other illegal burning. The City is recommending people to call the Open Burn Hotline 502-782-6592.
