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## PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Teachers!

It's April, which means it's time for our last batch of recitals and festivals of the season! I don't have a whole lot to say, except to remind you to sign up to participate in these recitals!

On Thursday April 6, a good friend of mine, Tanner Cassidy, will give a music theory presentation. He will discuss Topic Theory, a somewhat recent analytical method in the broader field of academic music theory which covers a lot of the typical "tropes" we hear in music. Mozart and Haydn particularly benefit from this kind of analysis, as it helps us to hear, two and a half centuries later, all the references and implied jokes in their instrumental music.

On April 22, we will have the Branch Honors Recital at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church. Please note that this particular recital will be held in their sanctuary. You can still park in the usual parking lot next to the fellowship hall.

If you have students that need to do a make-up CM evaluation, the deadline for parents and students to apply for that is April 15, 2023. Parents with students who were "no-shows" for CM should have received an email explaining the process and the issues that are considered acceptable excuses. If approved, students will be able to submit materials for make-up evaluations until May 9, 2023.

One thing discussed at this meeting was that a good way to hear newer pieces is as a CM evaluator. # **April General Meeting**

Thanks to Marc Lombardino who provided the zoom room and hosted the meeting, on March 22 we had a roundtable discussion on new repertoire. Please contact me if you would like a list of the repertoire discussed.

We hope you will join our next general meeting on **Thursday, April 6**, at 10 via zoom. Tanner Cassidy will present Topic Theory which is a method of analysis where you identify typical tropes in a piece and their cultural relevance at the time, for instance, a horn call in a classical indicating an association with nobility. He will discuss this theory both broadly related to his dissertation and specifically involving a Mozart sonata, K. 332, in F Major.

The followings are his short bio:

Tanner Cassidy is a Ph.D. student in music theory. His research interests include twentieth-century Japanese music, topic theory, film music, music and politics, jazz, and neo-Riemannian theory. His dissertation focuses on the ways that postwar Japanese composers incorporated musical topics into film scores, and how these composers contributed to the construction of narrative allegory as a response to postwar political and cultural changes. He has presented at the Music and the Moving Image conference and Music Theory Midwest.

Tanner teaches music theory classes in the Music Department, and also coaches jazz ensembles and conducts the UCSB Pops Orchestra. Off campus, Tanner is on the board of Opera Santa Barbara, and is also an employee of the Music Academy of the West.
