

Guidelines for applicants:

The Jan Royce Foundation is a Non-Profit, Charitable Trust, established to nurture young visual artists and musicians in South Africa.

Support (Financial, Practical, Organisational, Administrative) is available to enable eligible candidates to commence, complete or continue working on one of the following:

1. Visual Arts Project; or
2. Music Performance or Composition Project;

The Foundation will support one candidate in Visual Arts, and one candidate in Music each year. The candidate must be a citizen of South Africa, Lesotho, or Swaziland, and will be required to submit a valid ID number.

Types of Projects considered:

'Projects' could be defined, but not exclusively, as one of the following:

- Casting bronze sculpture(s);
- Large scale Painting;
- Photography printing for exhibition;
- Music performance, or music tour;
- Recording, or studio time;
- Engagement of musicians in realising composition.

Activities not supported:

The Foundation will not pay lump sum cash bursaries; rather they will support the payment of costs to be incurred, and help in the realisation of Music or Visual Arts initiatives. Therefore the Foundation will not consider:

- The purchase of Musical Instruments, or Art materials,
- Pay back loans incurred on proposed projects,

Selection Criteria:

Recipients will be chosen by a selected panel of professionals in the field of Arts and/or Music. Selection criteria will include:

- Overall cost of the project;
- Benefit of the project to the community;
- Artistic merit

How it works:

In addition to providing practical assistance, such as venues, or administration for Arts Initiatives, the Foundation will pay material, administration, and related costs associated with the Project. Successful applicants will be asked to present a full financial projection of the costs related to their Initiative.

Acceptance conditions:

Recipients will be required to:

1. Present, perform, exhibit, or display the final 'product' of the project in whichever format is most suitable, within 24 months of receiving the assistance. Visual Arts will be exhibited in the Jan Royce Gallery, 64 Church Street, Cape Town, at a time suitable to the Gallery and the artist. Musicians/Composers will perform in a concert at a suitable time. Part proceeds from Art sales, ticket sales, and/or similar will be contributed to the Jan Royce Foundation.
2. Allow Jan Royce Foundation to use their portrait image, details of the project or work, and bio details in promotion of the Foundation's work, on the Foundation website and various printed material.

In the event that the project, course of study, or funded activity is not completed, or realised, within the timeframe as described in the initial application proposal, and/or exceeds 24 months, the 'Bursary' must be repaid in full.

How To Apply:

Applicants must complete and submit the initial Application Form available as a download on the foundation website (janroycefoundation.com), and include with the application form the required documentation.

- Additional material/documentation that is not requested should not be submitted.
- Previous recipients may apply for a second bursary after 24 months of receiving the first.
- All submitted documentation must be in English.
