Watching Dwaine Hinkle sprint down the line toward first base, it wasn't surprising to learn he was a champion sprinter as a youth. In fact, he was a member of the Doane (NE) College track team that broke records in the 880-relays. Dwaine was a speedster who ran the 100- and 200-yard dashes and was also a high- and low-jumper. His speed stayed with him over the years, as he did very well in those events in the Senior Olympics just ten years ago.

Born in the village of Spalding, Dwaine moved to Ogallala in western Nebraska when he was four. He grew up there, graduating from Ogallala High in 1956. Dwaine says "he cut his teeth on a baseball." He was a switch-hitting leadoff batter and excellent bunter on his Midget and Legion teams. He later played softball as an adult, including two years on the Buckley Air National Guard Team that played in a highly-competitive fast-pitch league.

After graduating from Doane with a BA in Business and Economics, Dwaine began a successful career in sales with the All State Insurance Company in Denver. He retired in 1996 after 36 years with that company.
