Military units from the Marines, Fort Drum and the 174th Attack Wing also took part in the parade. The Expo was filled with representatives from many organizations which provide services and assistance to veterans and their families. Many of these individuals are volunteers who want to give back to the veteran community.

This year's event theme was "Women in the Military: Past, Present and Future", and three women were honored for their service to our nation: (Past) 1st Lieutenant Phyllis Creamer; (present) Chief Master Sgt. Sonja Williams; and (future) MIDN 1/C Precious Siddiquee. It was a wonderful tribute to not only these women, but to all who have served our community and nation.
