

CURFEW ORDINANCE

PASSED AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMBURG, ILLINOIS, February 11, 1957.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMBURG, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any minor or person below the age of her or his legal majority, between the hours of 10:00 o'clock P.M., and 5:00 o'clock A.M., without reasonable cause, to roam the streets in the Village of Hamburg, to loiter in streets or alleys, or other public places within said Village; and such person or persons so found, when unaccompanied by parent, parents, or legal guardian, said person is prima facie guilty of violating this ordinance.

Section 2. Any person who is a parent or guardian of a minor, found guilty of violation of this ordinance, is hereby declared guilty of contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Section 3. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance, shall be fined not less than Five DOLLARS (\$5.00), and not more than One Hundred DOLLARS (\$100.00), for the first offense. A fine of not less than Fifty DOLLARS (\$50.00) shall be imposed for a second or subsequent conviction of this offense.
