



CONGREGATIONAL CARE TEAM MINUTES

Communication falls under the Congregational Care Team. We met last week and the following questions and concerns were discussed and reviewed with Pastor Suzy. Acting on the initiative to improve communication, here are the answers we have to those questions.

In response to:

Weekly updates during worship on hospitalizations, deaths, etc.

Often the church does not know the information, or this is confidential information, and it is the person or family involved that requests that their information be kept confidential. The church should always err on the side of keeping a confidence. However, if you have an update on someone and have **THEIR APPROVAL** to share this information, please let Jennifer know before Wednesday so it can go in the bulletin.

Share minutes from Leadership Board

Yes, minutes will now be taken and published following Leadership Board meetings. The next meeting is to be held in April. Leadership Board meetings are open to everyone. Come and participate!

Suggest new initiatives be presented at Leadership Board before being implemented

In an effort to be more agile and responsive, it is only necessary if budget or building are going to be affected. If you have a good idea that is within the mission of the church (To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world), try it out. This is a new movement within United Methodism to help churches become more vital.

Frequent coffee hours with name tags

Name tags are an option, only if they are filled out each Sunday so anyone **new** will not be singled out for not having a "member" nametag. If we want more frequent coffee hours, we need to volunteer to do them. Choose a week and ask the office to put it on the church calendar. At end of service, ask Pastor Suzy to announce coffee hour and to encourage everyone to take this opportunity to talk to someone they don't know.

Keep notices and announcements in bulletin and in newsletter until they are finished, especially NEW items

This should be happening now. We will monitor and try to do a better job on this.

MI UM Conference Merger

The Detroit Annual conference and the West Michigan Conference of the UMC will be merging and becoming the Michigan Conference, effective January 2019. In anticipation of this change, the annual conferences have elected to move from 12 districts to 9 on July 1, 2018. This means all current districts will be dissolving, including our own, the Blue Water District. We will be participating in a celebration of the Blue Water District on February 11 from 2-4 PM at the Lake Huron Retreat Center.

Under the new configuration, our congregation will be part of District 6. District 6 will include the eastern half of the thumb down to about St. Clair. It then runs west to Byron. And the boundary goes north to Chesaning. For a detailed list of churches visit the MichiganUMC.org website. Our District Superintendent will be Reverend John Hice. I look forward to meeting him soon. It's an exciting time to be a Christian and a United Methodist as we participate in the unfolding of the church of the future.

National MFSA to locate in Detroit

Methodist Federation for Social Action follows its values to a new location in Michigan.

January 29, 2018 — Darlene DiDomineck, Interim Executive Director for the Methodist Federation for Social Action, announced today that MFSA will move its national office from Washington DC to Detroit during the summer of 2018. Central United Methodist Church will be the new home base of operations for the progressive advocacy network.

The change comes out of an 18-month strategic planning process that framed key questions for the future: *How do we dismantle white supremacy in our organization, the church, and our communities*? and *How can our white dominant organization become antiracist in a holistic way, with our leadership, our finances, our partners, our administrative structure, and our organizing model?*

"We felt a strong call to model—with our national Office and staffing—the values that are emerging from these questions," DiDomineck said. "Those values include a recommitment to local church and community-led grass-roots organizing. Like the kind of creative and collaborative organizing that is being done in Detroit and at Central UMC."

Other factors cited for the relocation were Central UMC's connections with various justice-seeking communities and its location in an area of great diversity. "This move decentralizes MFSA's advocacy efforts out of DC and models the importance of grassroots activism at the local, state and national level," DiDomineck added.
