

Travel Adventures: Tent Sale at Keepsake Quilts, New Hampshire

By email from my friend Sandra, who lives near Ottawa

We had a mentor who has been to the sale 12 years in a row, and she gave us written instructions! She said to bring a chair, several tote bags, and a blanket. She said she got there at 3:30 a.m. because you want to be in the first 50 -- they let 50 in at a time and you can stay in as long as you want. The chairs and blanket are for the wait and the tote bags are for the scrap boxes (more later) and also to put stuff in while in the tent. We arrived at 4:40 a.m. and were 26th in line. We loaded up our totes in about 2 hours in the tent, examined them, returned some items, and paid. I got a few kits (Debbie got a \$200 one for \$10, but I didn't even like it), some fabric (yardage and jelly rolls and layer cakes etc.), some patterns.

Now about those scrap boxes. There are scraps from 1/2 yard up to several yards. Most are at least 1/2 yard. Everything you can fit into a zip lock bag (about a quart) is \$6.99. You have to poke (or bite) holes in the bag to let the air out. You fold and roll the fabric. The bag must be zipped shut. Debbie later measured one of her bags, about 4 1/2 yards was in it. Who could know we would have so much fun doing that? They let us start with the scrap boxes at about 7. We stopped at 7:45 to line up for entry to the tent (put our totes of scraps under a blanket) and then continued after we did the tent. At around 7:40 they had a raffle --first prize in the tent 15 minutes early, 2nd 10 minutes, 3rd 5 minutes.

Had a lot of fun and I don't feel like buying any more fabric. The store left the door open so people could use the bathroom. Very nice of them. Some people slept on the porch overnight!!

We were on the road home by 1 p.m. There were still long lines to get into the tent. Our mentor stays for the 2nd day -- the tent items are an additional 20% off then. Also she and her sisters fill about 170 scrap bags -- she sends them to other sisters especially one who does charity quilts. I hate to admit it but I had 17 scrap bags. Lots of batiks, some wool, some flannel, a little bit of 30s.
