



**Get Connected**

Kinadom-tide I

The days are getting longer which means Summer will soon be here! This past May we celebrated National Women's Health Week: and this



upcoming June we celebrate Men's Health Month and Minority Health Month in July. I encourage you all to schedule your annual check-ups with your Primary Care Provider. I have a short list of questions for you to ask during your appointment below.

With the sun being out for longer the CDC recommends everyone regardless of skin color wear sunscreen with at least 15 SPF, which should be reapplied every 2 hours when outside. While it is nice to get a sun-kissed glow, "UV rays tend to be strongest from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m." the CDC advises. Exposure to UV rays can lead to an increased risk of developing skin cancer so it is important to make sure sunscreen is applied before going outdoors. However, sunscreen should be avoided in children 6 months and younger but if they must be outside babies should spend more time in shaded areas with sunhats, UV protective clothing and sunglasses. A bonus side effect is that they look very cute!

This past week I was lucky enough to attend the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference in Baltimore. I had a great time learning about lay leadership, participated in a community service project where I met Bishop Easter-

### **Conference Report with Reflections**

It was an eye opener to attend the 239<sup>th</sup> Conference of the Baltimore Washing Conference of the United Methodist Church in

person. About 1,200 members which included clergy and laity came together to sing praises to our God, learn from each other, perform mission work, and have very deep conversations in person for the first time since 2019. Coming together for holy conferencing in person was uplifting, it was nothing



compared to the 238<sup>th</sup> conference held via Zoom.

The theme for this year was "It's All About Love". I saw love in action in the warm embraces received from people whom I met for the first time. As a volunteer, I also witnessed the warm smiles when participants received their welcome packets.

Thanks to all GSUMC Council members who submitted their votes on the proposed resolutions. The resolutions/ recommendations that passed will be presented at the General Conference to be held April 23 – May 3, 2024.

The discussions held when the proposed resolutions (recommendations) were brought up were very intense.

### Leadership

Things got so heated that made me wonder where is the <u>Love</u> in the theme of the year? A clergy member had to interrupt the discussions during one of the sessions to offer a prayer so that the spirit of God can return to the room.

Below are the results of the ten resolutions/ recommendations brought forward for votes:

- Passed a protocol and policy that addresses providing paid bereavement leave for clergy;
- Supported steps to ensure the best alternative use of available church properties for missional purposes
- Voted to identify and oppose apartheid in the Holy Land;
- Supported two weeks of paid maternity and paternity leave for clergy foster/ resource parents;
- Affirmed the Queer Delegates' Call to Center Justice and Empowerment for LGBTQIA+ People in the UMC;
- Opposed a resolution to request district superintendents aspire to preside at each local church conference;
- Moved to postpone indefinitely a resolution that asks that those seeking to
  leave the denomination not serve in
  positions of leadership in the conference, districts and local churches;
- Voted to support the creation of a U.S. Regional Conference;
- Supported the removal of discriminatory policies in the Book of Discipline; and
- Referred the policy for churches that want to disaffiliate and later return to the BWC, to the Board of Trustees.



It's the good time for the unchurched to engage in faith. Begin with your children and spouse. You may or may not change them. God BRING A FRIEND can change. Your job is to bring





nothing I say in this article could even begin to capture all that she does for us.


