On June 15, at approximately 10:00 PM, a resident of Meadowbrook Road reported that they heard a loud noise in their garage. When they went to investigate, they observed smoke and flames and called 911. The Wyckoff Police along with the Wyckoff Fire Department responded to the scene. The fire was contained to the garage and was extinguished by the fire department. Fire damage was limited to the garage, however, the adjoining house suffered smoke and heat damage. The Wykoff Fire Official determined the cause of the fire to be an electric scooter with a lithium-ion battery that was plugged in and charging.
