WEEKLY THOUGHTS 30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 25th 2020.

Dear Friends, welcome to the celebration of the 30th Day of the Lord. Last Sunday, we heard in the Gospel Reading of the two warring factions; the Sadducees and Pharisees joining together to trap Jesus with a controversial question. Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?

Jesus aware of the consequences responded to render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God. We should give everything to God as Jesus gave everything to God – his allegiance to do the will of God.

In today's gospel, the Pharisees make another attempt to trap Jesus in a theological argument about the greatest commandment of the law; "Which is the greatest commandment of the law? In other words "what is the essence of the OT law?"

Jesus responds quoting Deut. 6:5 and Lev.19:18 "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with your entire mind." Deut. 6:5 "Love your neighbor as yourself." On these commandments the rest are built.

The entire sermon on the mountain is based on the love of God and neighbor. In Jn. 13:34 Jesus emphasize the commandment of love; "I give you a new commandment, love one another as I have loved you, so must your love be for each other."

"Always believe in the power of love and truth, the love of neighbor which is rooted in the love of God and the truth which sets us free." John Paul II

Let us be guided by the love of God and mankind.
