BIRDATHON 2019 UPDATE



Congratulations to all on a good Birdathon again this year. We especially thank our sponsors and counters without whom the Birdathon would not be possible. We appreciate

your participation and support for our conservation and education endeavors. Thanks, too, for our hard-working members who handle the details--Jane Fowler who handles the mailings.

It appears that our total receipts and pledges will be about \$4,300. There may still be a few checks yet to come in this year. The money will go to chapter operations, Rio Bosque Wetlands Park, Audubon Texas, Second Chance Wildlife Rescue, Stick House Sanctuary, and the El Paso Zoo Raptor Rehabilitation Program.

Species seen by at least one counter were tallied. A total of 166 species were seen, compared to 155 last year and 155 in 2017.

The winners for the highest number of species seen by an individual or party were again John Kiseda and Richard Hermosillo with 126. Very good!

The prize for the most money raised went to John Sproul.

The most unusual bird this year was a Hermit Warbler found by Kevin Floyd and Victoria Milne.



Runner-up was a Rose-breasted Grosbeak seen by Eddie Chew and Susie Schneider at her house.

AT FEATHER LAKE

So far in 2019, Feather Lake has been completely dry. It is the longest dry spell to start the year since the infamous 2011, the year Feather Lake abruptly shifted from being wet most of the time to dry most of the time. In 2011, the lake basin was dry for 7.5 months before a mid-August storm delivered some runoff. With the irrigation season beginning in June, will we see the current streak end?

On May 25, Boy Scouts from Troop 4 were hard at work clearing the trail along the east side of Feather Lake. This project will continue with 2 more work sessions in June, led by Eagle Scout candidate Nathan Perez.

Our next workday will be **Sat.**, **June 8**, starting at **8 a.m.** Want to give the Feather Lake brush mower a spin? Here's your chance.

Water deliveries to the park from the adjacent Roberto Bustamante Wastewater Treatment Plant resumed May 1.




Most of that water went into the old river channel and only a little into the park's wetland cells. The start of the irrigation season in June will make additional water available and provide a boost to the wetland cells. Birds now being seen at the park include a Whitetailed Kite, Northern Cardinals and Painted Buntings. For up-to-date information on Rio Bosque's birds and water conditions, check www.riobosque.org. 
