The fruit of LOVE when properly motivated "is pure, far reaching, forgiving. There is no limit to the good that LOVE does. God is LOVE. (I John 4:7)

JOY never fades, it is never destroyed by circumstances, it is unaffected by wealth or poverty, sickness or health. It is found in the presence of God (Psalm 16:11)

PEACE "is a tranquility of mind as a result of a right relationship with God". The PEACE of God in our hearts challenges sin at every turn and deals with it immediately in order to maintain that right relationship. (Ephesians 2:14)

LONG-SUFFERING means steadfastness of the soul under provocation. It means forbearance and patient endurance of ill-treatment, without anger or thought of revenge. (Colossians 3:12, 13)

GENTLENESS is sweet reasonableness, calmness and

graciousness. It calms troubled waters, settles turmoil and heals strife. (James 3:17)

GOODNESS does good to others. It is kindness of heart and good deeds. It may not always be a gentle word, but a stern rebuke done for the good of someone else. (Psalm 33:5)

MEEKNESS disarms the stormy, tempestuous person. The qualities of mildness and gentleness in dealing with others. It is not weak. It is a high quality of spiritual strength. (I Timothy 6:11)

RESCUED FROM DANGER

Devotional Reading: Psalm 116:1-14

Scripture: Jonah 2

Key Verse: *But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Deliverance belongs to the Lord! Jonah 2:9*

Central Thought: A Love That Delivers.

Lesson Objective: To better understand a process by which God delivers.

Lesson Introduction

God has ways and means of doing whatever love requires of God. It could be reconciling, perfecting, building good will, making joy complete, and emerging victorious over death - whatever love requires.

Using the goodwill created by the loving spirit of God dwelling in them and around them. Jonah and the sailors had attempted to save those whose lives were in grave because of a tempestuous storm used by God to display God's displeasure.

It is proposed that those God loves, God chastens and delivers. The lesson today will highlight a process God used to deliver a fleeing prophet - a deserter, and sailors of good will engaged with Jonah, trying to make the best of a bad situation. We saw God in last week's lesson allowing the endangered men to do what they could and would do to save themselves.

Today, in the end, we observe God taking over and love delivering.

Lesson Outline

- I. **Calling Out to the Lord: Jonah 2:1-3.**
- II. **Context and Content of the Call: Vv. 4-8.**
- III. **The Promise Then Deliverance: Vv. 9-10.**

Lesson Comments

I. Calling Out to the Lord: Jonah 2:1-3.
¹*Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from inside the fish. ²He said, "I cried out to the Lord in my great trouble, and he answered me. I called to you from the land of the dead, and Lord, you heard me! ³You threw me into the ocean depths, and I sank down to the heart of the sea. The mighty waters engulfed me; I was buried beneath your wild and stormy waves.*

What had motivated the thinking of Jonah up to this point? Perhaps he thought that the situation could be worked out without having to be confronted by God. Paraphrasing from William Shakespeare's play. "A Midsummer Night's Dream," "Lord what fools we (these) mortals be." Was Jonah that unaware of God's identity, the One who called him to the office of a prophet? In verse 1, he did make a passing reference to the Lord he worshiped. But it, at best, seemed to have been a causal reference. Apparently he knew more about the people of Nineveh than he did about his God. I say that because he was more concerned about the power of the Ninevites to hurt, than about the

power of God to help. Therefore, he fled to Tarshish, rather than going to Nineveh as he had been ordered.

Nevertheless, when in jeopardy and deep trouble, with no one else to turn to, Jonah said, "I called to the Lord out of my distress, and he answered me," (2:2). Not only did God answer Jonah, God delivered him. Unlike the sailors, God asked no questions, for God knew all of the answers regarding Jonah. God knew more about Jonah than Jonah knew about himself.

Thus, the first step in the love delivery process is to call out to God. Jonah did not allow his past unfaithfulness to deter him from calling out to the Lord. This step is completely in the caller's hands. Jonah said that God heard his voice. Ours is call - step one. God will hear - step two. Having God to hear is having God to answer. Thus, God's process has begun. Could delivery be far away?

II. Context and Content of the Call: Vv. 4-8.

⁴*Then I said, 'O Lord, you have driven me from your presence. Yet I will look once more toward your holy Temple.'*
⁵*"I sank beneath the waves, and the waters closed over me. Seaweed wrapped itself around my head. ⁶I sank down to the very roots of the mountains. I was imprisoned in the earth, whose gates lock shut forever. But you, O lord my God, snatched me from the jaws of death! ⁷As my life was slipping away, I remembered the Lord.*

THE ARMOR OF GOD

EPHESIANS 6:10-18
 "... Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes." v. 10, 11

The Shield of Faith (Eph. 6:16)
 Faith is being sure that God will keep His promises. Faith in God protects you when you are tempted to doubt.

Feet Prepared with the Gospel of Peace (Eph. 6:15)
 The Gospel of Peace is being right with God and being contented in troubled times. Jesus said peacemakers were blessed.

The Helmet of Salvation (Eph. 6:17)
 Put on the Helmet of Salvation by believing that Jesus Christ died for your sins and rose again.

The Breastplate of Righteousness (Eph. 6:14)
 Righteousness is being honest, good, humble, and fair to others. It means standing up for weaker people.

The Belt of Truth (Eph. 6:14)
 Truth keeps us from giving in to the world's beliefs. Compare your beliefs and actions to the truth of the Word of God.

The Sword of the Spirit (Eph. 6:17)
 which is the Word of God. God's Word is our offensive weapon. When we tell others what the Bible says, the Holy Spirit helps people see their bad thoughts and actions, and makes them want to be forgiven.

Ephesians 6:10-20 (New King James Version)

10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age,^[a] against spiritual *hosts* of wickedness in the heavenly *places*. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. 14 Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; 18 praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints— 19 and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, 20 for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.

Pentecost (June 4, 2017)

Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian Church and reveals the descent or out pouring of the Holy Spirit on the believers in the Upper Room. ¹*On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place.* ²*Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting.* ³*Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them.* ⁴*And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability.* Acts 2:1-4)

The Season After Pentecost


The Season After Pentecost is sometimes referred to as Whitsuntide or Trinity season. This period has also been divided by some denominations into The Season After Pentecost and Kingdomtide. When the period is divided, The Season After Pentecost covers 10-14 Sundays, and Kingdomtide covers 13-14 Sundays.

Color: Red is the liturgical color for the Season After Pentecost. Red is symbolic of loyalty, power, witness, Christian zeal, blood, fire, the work and ministry of the church, and the Holy Spirit.



And my earnest prayer went out to you in your holy Temple. ⁸Those who worship false gods turn their backs on all God's mercies.

Step three is knowing the seriousness of your trouble. The context of any situation greatly influences the words spoken and the action taken in the situation. The conditions (or context) in Jonah's case are graphically stated and they portray dire circumstances. Jonah misstates the facts in verse 4. he was not driven away from God's sight. He chose to leave, to be disobedient. Perhaps the burden was more difficult to bear because the blame fell squarely on Jonah. But, nevertheless, he was no longer in God's sight in the holy temple. Further, the forces of nature were furious and deadly. The waters, the weeds, the deep, the roots of the mountains, and the enclosing bars joined in creating a death scene.

Jonah declared that his "life was ebbing away," (2:7); and in those terrifying moments, he remembered the Lord. Then he prayed a prayer that reached God in the holy temple. Need I speak of the content of the call or the nature of the prayer? I think not. Consider again the context.

III. The Promise Then Deliverance: Vv. 9-10.

⁹*But I will offer sacrifices to you with song of praise, and I will fulfill all my vows. For my salvation comes from the Lord alone."*

¹⁰*Then the Lord ordered the fish to spit Jonah out onto the beach.*

Step four is knowing and taking the right approach to God. Verse 9 refers to a "voice of thanksgiving." Giving thanks can be a reflection of attitude, a contrite

spirit, and a changed heart, rather than a formality anticipating the petitions and intercessions of the prayers. Notice the giving of thanks preceded deliverance. It was before the fact.

Jonah promised to sacrifice and made a vow to pay his obligation. (I wonder if the Lord smiled at Jonah spoke of vows and promises again?) vows and promises were not unusual for prophets of God. But whatever the case, deliverance was pending.

Step five involved a declaration that "Deliverance belongs to the lord." it positions one to find favor in the eyes of the Lord. Were not favor, forgiveness, grace, reconciliation, and deliverance the cause of the incarnation? Did Christ not come to set the captives free? Isn't He inclined by choice to seek, find, and restore? However, you must show some signs. It appears that Jonah did that. The deliverance protocol began with a call to the Lord and a prayer of thanksgiving. Then deliverance came. But things were in order for the hands and the will of the Lord.

Lesson Sidelights

As an aside, it seems like God was determined to deliver Jonah. God set out to do it. God was going to do it, and God did it! There is little to justify, from a human point of view, the rescue of Jonah. Was he remorseful regarding his disobedience? Was there ever an indication of his change of heart and mind and an effort relative to going to Nineveh? Did there seem to be an inner struggle, a wedding with God in the matter? Apparently not! Even the life-threatening storm did not prevent him from sleeping soundly in the hold of the ship. Fleeing from God in the midst of a raging storm did not disturb Jonah.

Thus, the determination to deliver was the Lord's concern. Jonah had his own agenda and was prepared to pursue it until the end. But deliverance speaks to the nature and purpose of God. The Creator was not going to allow a creature to alter the divine plan and heart-felt intent of God.

Lesson Applications

What can we carry away from this lesson that has a daily life application value? That which sticks out in my mind, are the steps in the process of God's delivery plan. Therefore, we conclude the lesson reviewing these steps. As we have shared them with each other, let us share them with others. While deliverance by God from our deadly circumstances is the divine work of God, and often appears to be event specific, there is in fact a process involved. In each delivery event, close examination will reveal action, reaction, and counter action.

Focusing on Jonah's release from his deep and deadly trouble, the following sequence is observed:

- ◆ Step one - The call out to God.
- ◆ Step two - The assurance that God will hear the call.
- ◆ Step three - The knowledge of the jeopardy.
- ◆ Step four - The Prayer to God.
- ◆ Step five - The Declaration of faith: "Deliverance belongs to the Lord," (2:9)

SCATTERING SEEDS

READ: Matthew 13:1-9

The seed falling on good soil...produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Matthew 13:23

I received a wonderful email from a woman who wrote, "Your mom was my first-grade teacher at Putnam City in 1958. she was a great teacher and very kind, but strict! She made us learn the 23rd Psalm and say it in front of the class, and I was horrified. But it was the only contact I had with the Bible until 1997, when I became a Christian. And the memories of Mrs. McCasland came flooding back as I re-read it."

Jesus told a large crowd a parable about the farmer who sowed his seed that fell on different types of ground—a hard path, rocky ground, clumps of thorns, and good soil (Matthew 13:1-9). While some seeds never grew, "the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it" and "produces a crop yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown" (v.23).

During the twenty years my mother taught first grade in public schools, along with reading, writing, and arithmetic she scattered seeds of kindness and the message of God's love.

Her former student's email concluded, "I have had other influences in my Christian walk later in life, of course. But my heart always return to [Psalm] and [your mom's] gentle nature."

A seed of God's love sown today may produce a remarkable harvest.

Lord, today I want my life to sow good seeds in those around me. Help me to give out what You have put in me.
