

# Applique Workshop

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## HOMEWORK AND SUPPLY LIST

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Workshop is to show three techniques of applique using the Accuquilt Go Cutter

Needle turn using freezer paper and starch

Needle turn using single sided fusible web and glue stick

Machine applique with double sided fusible web

Finished Project approximately 13 x 29 table runner

### **Homework:**

Fabrics cut:

**3** of each

Basket and handle fabric 6 ½ x 6 ½

Flower fabric 3 ½ x 3 ½

Flower center 2 x 2

Stem fabric 6 ½ x 3 ½

Background fabric 7 ½ x 9 1/2

**6** Leaves fabric 2 ½ x 2 ½

**2** corner stones fabric 6 x 6

**1** sashing fabric 8 x WOF

**1** binding fabric 8" x WOF

Batting 14 x 30

Backing fabric 16 x 32

**Freezer paper, single and double fusible webbing will be provided at class**

Supplies:

Marking pen or pencil

Sewing machine

Thread

Straight pins

Paper scissors

Cloth scissors with a good cutting point

Iron and board and pressing cloth or rag

Rotary cutter, ruler, and board

Embroidery thread (only if doing blanket stitch instead of machine)

Millinery or straw needle size 10

Sponge or rag for cleaning tools

Basting pins or spray

**Steps that can be done prior to the class to save time if you wish**

Once this part is done you will have your table runner top complete ready for the applique. It is not necessary to have this step done prior to class. I just suggest it because we may run out of time to do the sashing and corner stones in class. But you can complete this part at home after the class as well if we run short of time. I will be available anytime should any of you need further help. Just give me a call.

Cut **8** 2 ½ squares for corner stones

Cut 2 ½ strips for sashing. Sub cut into **6** 7 ½ and **4** 9 ½ pieces.

Sew 9 ½ inch sashing to the left side of the background blocks and one strip to the right of last block that will be on the right side of your table runner. Sew these three blocks together.

Sew a corner stone to the left on the 6 7 ½ inch sashing strip. Sew 3 strips together length wise twice and add a final corner stone to each. Sew one of these to the top of the blocks making sure your seams align. Sew the rest to the bottom of each block, again making sure seams align. Make sure corner stones are on top of each 9 ½ inch vertical sash.

Now you're ready to applique!
