2016 was another busy and productive year in Calumet Park. There was quite a bit of movement on the economic front, new personnel, continued hard work from our departments, and ongoing efforts in paving and infrastructure projects. I am so grateful to our Trustees and staff for their dedication to our Village and providing us with a safe and unique place to live. With that being said, I would like to highlight many of the Village's activities this past year.

#### **Economic Development**

Mack Industries, a private developer investing \$12 million dollars to build quality mixed-use commercial and residential properties at 124th & Ashland Avenue. Approximately 15,000 sq. ft. of retail and 90 residential units within walking distance to the Metra Train Station.

McDonald's prototype restaurant remodel and expansion of its drive-thru was completed.

Speedway, LLC construction plans underway to build a new 4,608 sq. ft. gas/diesel station at the corner of 119th and Wood Streets across from the Marshfield Plaza. Taco Bell construction plans underway to build a new 2,480 sq. ft. prototype restaurant next

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## **Public Works & Water Departments**

The Public Works and Water Departments had a very busy year. In addition to weekly services performed during the year such as garbage removal, grass cutting, snow plowing and salting, projects are continuously ongoing to improve infrastructure throughout the year as highlighted below.

- Paving and patching of village streets and allevs
- Sidewalk repairs and replacement
- Tree trimming and removal
- Fire hydrant flushing and replacement
- Installation of new reflective street signs to comply with the uniform traffic control devices
- Maintenance and repairs of sewer and water main breaks
- Painting of curbs and including designated handicapped parking locations
- Deployment of LED Street Lighting Program
- GIS and mapping program of the west side of the Village
- Street sweeping
- Assist at Community Festival and special events held throughout the year
- Special clean-up days in spring and fall

As we approach the blast of winter snow, please observe the "no parking signs" when two (2) inches accumulates on the streets. To avoid hazardous conditions for pedestrians and motorist alike, keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice in front of your house and never push snow onto the streets.


# Safety Tips from Your Building Department Don't let electrical cords create a danger in your house!

Overloaded outlets and undersized electrical cords can cause a fire or electrocution danger. Electrical cords must be the proper size for the load they serve. Overloaded cords will become hot and can start a fire. Avoid permanent use of extension cords. Appliance cords and extension cords are susceptible to physical damage from foot traffic, furniture, house pets, swinging doors and many

other causes so protect from damage. them Contact your local building department for more information. When buying an extension cord please ask for help so that the right cord is purchased, never apt to save money and

jeopardized your life to save a few bucks. Make sure that you buy cords that have been approved by an independent testing laboratory such as (UL, SA, ETV).

- Never nail or staple cords to walls, trees, etc.
- Never use three-prong plugs with outlets that only have two slots. Never cut off the pin to force a fit, which could lead to electrical shock.
- Never use an extension cord or power strip with heaters or fans.
- Keep all outdoor extension cords free of snow and standing water.



A heavy reliance on extension cords is an indication that you have too few outlets to address your needs, and should have additional outlets install where you need them.

Use only listed power strips that have integral overload

protection and have been tested by a safety laboratory.
