#### July 7, 2019 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Send in reinforcements! Jesus calls up an additional 72 disciples in today's gospel to forward- advance the proclamation of God's Kingdom to come! Previously, Jesus had sent out the Twelve (12) apostles, yet now he calls up even more helpers to assist in the mission work of announcing God's Visitation to the world (Jesus). These were preparation teams who went ahead of Jesus to study and make inroads into the local culture. They lay the groundwork for the Kingdom of God that Jesus would fill-in/complete through his later teaching and miracles. These missions are modeled on John the Baptist's whole life, except that instead of staying in the desert and waiting for people to come to you, these disciples took the message on the road to all the different towns & villages. The spoken message they delivered from Jesus was "The kingdom of God is at hand for you" (Luke 10:9). This delivered message of God's Kingdom (Jesus) to come, primed people to hear and receive the full teaching of Jesus when at last he came. To really be open to receive anything new and lasting, a person has to be aware and know what one already has. So the disciples' forward staging work was to call people to review their lives (repent) and to take stock of one's own world. Inventory questions like "What am I doing? How is life going? What am I committed to, and am I living it faithfully?", are excellent means to evaluate the meaning of my life. Artificiality, deception and illusion creep into life so easily, and the disciples' job was to invite people to ask 'integrity questions' like 'Why am I here?', 'How am I spending my life?' and 'Who am I serving?' St. Peter gives the same speech several times in the Acts of the Apostles that includes the call to examine one's life and change. At the end of his sermons, he says in Acts 2:38, "Repent and be baptized" and in Acts 3:19 "Repent, and be converted". What does that mean? He is repeating the style of John the Baptist, by calling people to daily spiritual change (see it in Mark 1:4 & Matt 3:2). To repent means re-examining one's life. To undergo baptism means getting serious about starting life over with Christ fully dedicated and intentional about growing spiritually. We may have just fallen into life, but to get out or rise up through it takes our daily commitment and focus.

I ran across a quote from Mark Twain last week that said," The two most important days in your life are the day you are born and the day you find out why." We Christians would call those days our birth day and our rebirth-day (conversion to Christ in Baptism!). By the apostles, disciples and Jesus announcing that the Kingdom of God is coming, they saying, "You can go off your own way alone and die or you can come be part of this divine fellowship and live!" Jesus invites us to live in the family of God. 1 John 3:2 says, "Beloved, we are God's children now", and Galatians 3:26 says, "You are all children of God in Christ Jesus." And what do you imagine comes along with being a child of God? Jesus tells us in John 10:10, "I came so that you might have life and have it more abundantly." Life to the fullest!

This leads us to the powerful witness of those first disciples that Jesus sent out taking along "no money bag, no sack, and no sandals" (Luke 10:4). What? No supplies for the mission. But that is the point. The disciples weren't sent to villages and towns to deliver material goods or take territory in Jesus' name. No, they were sent to introduce a new way of living: Kingdom of God Life! The Purpose of their mission was to deliver Jesus and relationship to Him. So they embodied that relationship to Jesus who would provide for them all they needed. They didn't need to load up baggage and drag along all kinds of physical comforts, because Jesus would give them all they needed for His work when they needed it. The disciples embodied total trust, faith and dependence upon Jesus. And they were joyful about the work. And they had inner peace. Such trust and contentment had to have a dramatic impact upon the towns they visited. These disciples trusted their Lord would provide and He did! The disciples' trust in Jesus, led many villagers to eagerly anticipate meeting Jesus Himself when he came later.

So, how do we embody our relationship to Jesus? Since we are God's children too, how is it reflected in our living? Baptism and ongoing repentance calls us to trust God more, and to live with greater trust in God. What can we do to better show our relationship to God as Christians? Romans 12:2 invites us to show our trust by, "not conforming ourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." And Ephesians 4:22-24, calls us to "put away your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, putting on the new self, created in God's way." That is our mission!
