Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord (B) Mk 11:1–10 or Jn 12:12–16 Is 50:4–7 Phil 2:6–11 Mk 14:1–15:47 or 15:1–39



Empty Praise

"Hosanna!" would be viewed as empty praise? Though the word has come down to us in the Greek Gospels, it probably has Hebrew roots as a form of the verb "to save" (see Psalm 118:25). Thus, it is more than an exuberant cry; it is a plea for salvation. How could this possibly be empty praise?

The answer to that question is found in human fickleness. So often we—not simply the people of Jerusalem, but we human beings—wholeheartedly offer someone our support, only to turn our backs on that person when the going gets tough. We know from experience how this works.

This is precisely what today's readings describe. The passage for the procession with palms describes an enthusiastic group of people showing Jesus great respect and crying out: "Hosanna!" Later, in the Gospel we hear, "Crucify him!" Were these the same people? Does it matter? Presumably these were people who were in Jerusalem to celebrate Passover, the feast of their deliverance from Egyptian bondage. Now they are caught in another oppressive political system—Roman occupation. Are these heartless people? Or are they like us: often afraid to take an unpopular stand lest we lose face or, even worse, suffer serious consequences? And so, Jesus stands alone before those who have planned to silence him. Might he have considered the earlier "Hosanna" empty praise? Probably not. Jesus does not hold our fickleness against us.

Dear Padre,

I recently converted to Catholicism. Can you tell me more about the significance of the palm branches on Palm Sunday?

We can consider the meaning of the palm branches on two levels. On the first level, we commemorate a historical event—Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

In biblical times, people saw the palm as a kingly tree because of its height and majestic appearance. During festivals, the Jews carried palm branches in processions. Roman soldiers carried palm branches in their victory parades. In public games, the winners of contests and sports received palm branches as signs of victory. Thus, when people greeted Jesus with palm branches, they

were greeting him in the spirit of joy and triumph usually reserved for victorious kings, armies, and athletes. It was the biblical equivalent of a ticker-tape parade!

That brings us to the second meaning for the palm branches. They do signify a joyful victory, but not in the worldly and military sense of the word. It is a victory that we can understand and celebrate only in the light of the other events of Holy Week and Easter Sunday.

The ultimate victory of Jesus was his Easter triumph over death and sin. But it was a victory won through suffering and dying. This is the victory we recall on Palm Sunday. Even though we must relive the sad events of Holy Thursday and Good Friday, we know the triumphant outcome of the story. Knowing that outcome enables us to make Palm Sunday the beginning of our victory celebration.



Holy Week



As Holy Week is approaching, I thought it might be good to explain what will be happening in these days that focus so clearly the work of our redemption.

We begin with **Palm Sunday**, a day of triumph for Our Lord when He enters to the sound of rejoicing by the crowds waving palm branches, but it also is a day when we hear St. Mark's account of Our Lord's Suffering, Crucifixion, Death, and Burial. We take our blessed palms home to remind us of this day that heralded our salvation.

Lent officially ends at noon on Holy Thursday. It is then that the Church begins the observance of the Sacred Triduum, three days that are the very heart of our Catholic Faith. On **Holy Thursday** we join with Our Lord and the Apostles in the Upper Room where we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper when Our Lord gave us the great gift of His Most Holy Body and Blood in the Eucharist. At the end of the Mass that night, we are asked to spend some time in quiet adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, but our vigil does not end as we prepare to remember Good Friday.

Good Friday is a day in which we fast and abstain in order to unite our hearts and minds with that of Christ Jesus as we remember His Passion and Death. Stations of the Cross will be offered at noon at

Immaculate Conception Church with the children performing the Living Stations. A collection will be taken up to assist the charitable work of the Ministerial Alliance. At 3:00 PM, the hour at which Our Lord laid down His life on the Cross, Stations of the Cross will be offered at St. Patrick's. Then at 7:00 PM, the Liturgy of the Passion will be observed at Immaculate Conception.

Holy Saturday during the day is one of quiet reflection and prayer in our homes as we contemplate Christ Jesus lying in the tomb. Then as darkness falls, we see the Light of Christ shine in the Easter Vigil that will be at Immaculate Conception at 8:00 PM during which time we hear the ancient prophecies and rejoice in the news of the Risen Christ. We renew our Baptismal promises and sing songs of joy and gladness that Our Lord is truly Risen.

Then, on **Easter Sunday** we will gather together at St. Patrick's at 8:00 AM Mass as the sun rises to greet the glory of Easter Morning and then at 10:00 AM at Immaculate Conception to add our songs of praise and thanksgiving to the Lord who has triumphed over the grave and called us to the glory of being called the children of God.

Because the Easter Triduum is seen as one continuous liturgy, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are so closely linked that they are to be celebrated in the same location each year. This gives a continuity to what we are remembering and what is revealed to us about God's Plan for our salvation. This year the Sacred Triduum will be held at Immaculate Conception but everyone from St. Patrick and any other surround parishes are welcome to take part in witnessing these wonderful expressions of our Faith that are presented through the scriptures, through our prayers together, and in the unity that we share as members of the Mystical Body of Christ.

I hope that all of us will prepare well for Holy Week this year as we receive the news of great joy that Jesus Christ has died for our sins, has risen from the dead, and who brings us the promise of eternal life.
