
## Join us on Saturday, June 29 for a bus trip to the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land and the Museum of the Bible in Washington,

The Diocesan Men's Conference is Saturday, April 6, 2019, at Bishop McDevitt High School. The theme is *Men Called to be Saints*. The Keynote Speaker is Dr. John Bergsma, noted Catholic author, speaker, Bible expert, and theology professor at Franciscan University of Steubenville. The title of his keynote address is *The Top 3 Reasons I Became Catholic and Always Will Be: Perspectives from a Former Protestant Pastor*. ## The Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

In the early church, there were various little ceremonies that prepared catechumens for Baptism at the Easter Vigil. In the Second Vatican Council, the Catholic Church recovered the importance of these ceremonies. Three of those ceremonies are called "Scrutinies."

## The Scrutinies

Celebrated at the 8:30 AM Masses on these Sundays:

First-- March 24 Second-- March 31 Third-- April 7

## The Spiritual Purpose of the Scrutinies:

"The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all." (§141 in *The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults*)

# **Casino in Shippensburg?**

Last Monday, there was a hearing conducted by the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board regarding the proposed casino to be built in Shippensburg Township. I encourage all parishioners to access the Board's website (<u>https://gamingcontrolboard.pa.gov/</u>), click on "PGCB Meeting Videos" and watch the video of the hearing.

As Catholic Christians, we are not opposed to games of chance per se. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

Games of chance (card games, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others. The passion for gambling risks becoming an enslavement. Unfair wagers and cheating at games constitute grave matter, unless the damage inflicted is so slight that the one who suffers it cannot reasonably consider it significant (§2413).

As a pastor of souls and a member of the Shippensburg Association of Christian Ministers (SACM), I am concerned about the potential impact of the proposed casino. I support the statement that was delivered by Reverend Barbara Hutchinson on Monday evening.

With any decision like this, there are positives and negatives. The debate comes in discerning which one outweighs the other. There are all kinds of opinions in that regard. Catholic Christians could, in good conscience, disagree.

As a resident of Shippensburg Township, an active voter and a citizen, I am primarily concerned about whether the voice of the average ordinary local citizen is being heard-- the farmers, the professors, school teachers, the students, the health care workers, the business owners, the factory workers, the cashiers, the retirees-- **the people who live and work here**. If the people who live here want the casino, okay. But if there is widespread or overwhelming opposition at the grassroots level, why should it be built? This is why I wish that this issue were being decided via a referendum.

Based on conversations I have had this past week, it is clear that many local citizens are not even aware of what is happening. Hopefully this bulletin announcement will create more awareness of this issue.

Regardless of where you stand on the issue, I encourage you to raise your voice by contacting the PGCB. The deadline is tomorrow April 1, 2019. The founders of our nation intended that this nation be governed by the people. On this particular issue, the people who will be directly affected-- the people who live here-- should be the ones who make the decision.

My position on the casino is this: let the people decide. I don't know for sure what the people would choose if there were a referendum. But whatever their decision would be-- that is what would make sense in a country that is to be governed "of the people, by the people and for the people." Is the will of the people being heard and heeded on this issue? Are all of the local citizens even aware of what is happening?
