Della M. Johnston, 86, of Bad Axe, passed away on Nov. 4, 2011 at the Huron County Medical Care Facility.

Della was born on Aug. 18, 1925 in Fillion, the daughter of the late Joseph and Theresa (Steinetz) Carriveau. She married Wayne Charles Johnston on May 18, 1946 in Bad Axe. He preceded her in death on May 7, 1990. Della worked for Reeds Drug Store in Bad Axe, moved to Ubyly to manage a second Reeds store and later purchased that business with her husband, Wayne. Together they operated Johnston's Party Store until 1971, when the store was sold. They then moved to Bad Axe where Della worked at Murray's and Kritzman's until her retirement. She enjoyed working with and meeting people that she could help with their needs.

Della was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Bad Axe and the Order of Eastern Star. She enjoyed bowling, sponsored a bowling team in Ubyly that traveled to different tournaments, and supported all of Ubyly's activities. Della, along with several other friends her age, were a charter members in developing and casting the ever popular Alabama Jubilee during the 1960s. She loved spending time with friends and family, especially at her trailer in Oak Beach where she hosted many gatherings. Her strong family values, quiet personality and caring attitude made her many friends that span several generations.

She is survived by her son, David (Deborah) Johnston of Neenah, Wis.; four grandsons, Christopher (Amy) of Hazel Park, Bradford of St. Charles, Ill., Brent of Stevens Point, Wis., and Gregory of Lexington, SC; one great-grandson, Zachary of Hazel Park; two sisters, Catherine Dinsmore of Fort Smith, AK and Bertha June Stroschein of Bad Axe; two brothers, Robert (Eleanor) Carriveau of Kinde and Joseph (Donelda) Carriveau of Bad Axe; and numerous nieces and nephews.
