Sunday Reflection: Second Sunday of Lent

Are we prepared to see the glory of the Lord and to share in his glory as well? The Lord Jesus not only wants us to see his glory, he wants to share this glory with us. And Jesus shows us the way to the Father's glory: Follow me, obey my words. Take the path I have chosen for you and you will receive the blessing of my Father's kingdom. Your

name too will be written in heaven. Jesus fulfilled his mission on Calvary where he died for our sins so that Paradise and everlasting life would be restored to us. He embraced the cross to win a crown of glory, a crown that awaits each one of us if we, too, will follow in his footsteps.

Luke's Gospel tells us that while Jesus was transfigured, Peter, James, and John were asleep (Luke 9:32)! Upon awakening they discovered Jesus in glory along with Moses and Elijah. How much do we miss of God's glory and action because we are asleep spiritually? There are many things which can keep our minds asleep to the things of God: mental lethargy and the "unexamined life" can keep us from thinking things through and facing our doubts and questions. The life of ease can also hinder us from considering the challenging or disturbing demands of Christ. Prejudice can make us blind to something new the Lord may have for us. Are we spiritually awake? We, as disciples of Jesus Christ, are called to be witnesses of his glory. The Lord wants to reveal his glory to us, his beloved disciples. Do we seek his presence with faith and reverence? Let us pray: Lord Jesus, keep me always alert to you, to your word, your action, and your constant presence in my life. Let me see your glory.

Saint of the Week: St. Perpetua

"When my father in his affection for me was trying to turn me from my purpose by arguments and thus weaken my faith, I said to him, 'Do you see this vessel—water pot or whatever it may be? Can it be called by any other name than what it is?' 'No,' he replied. 'So also I cannot call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian.'"

So writes Perpetua: a young, beautiful, well-educated noblewoman of Carthage in North Africa, mother of an infant son and chronicler of the persecution of the Christians by Emperor Septimius Severus. Perpetua's mother was a Christian and her father a pagan. He continually pleaded with her to deny her faith. She refused and was imprisoned at age 22.

In her diary, Perpetua describes her period of captivity: "What a day of horror! Terrible heat, owing to the crowds! Rough treatment by the soldiers! To crown all, I was tormented with anxiety for my baby. Such anxieties I suffered for many days, but I obtained leave for my

baby to remain in the prison with me, and being relieved of my trouble and anxiety for him, I at once recovered my health, and my prison became a palace to me and I would rather have been there than anywhere else."

Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua refused to renounce her Christian faith. For her unwillingness, she was sent with several companions to the public games in the amphitheater. There Perpetua was beheaded.

St. Perpetua is the patron saint of widows and mothers of diseased sons.



Securing Our Church, Protecting Our People

In an effort to keep our church and all who attend Mass here safe, we will begin securing the doors to the church while Mass is being held. The doors will be locked approximately 10 minutes after Mass begins (in case anyone is running late). Please note that the door is locked from the outside only; it can be opened from the inside at all times if someone needs to leave early or in case of an emergency. This change will begin the weekend of March 18-19.

Safe Environment Training Update

Thank you to everyone who successfully completed their Safe Environment training before March 1!

There are still a few people who have not yet completed the training, and we need you to do so as soon as possible. A Diocesan-wide audit is scheduled for later this month. While we don't know if our parish will be included in the audit, we need to be prepared.

If you are a volunteer, which includes catechists, lectors, adult altar servers, extraordinary ministers, greeters, cantors and choir members, eucharistic ministers to the nursing home and homebound, Knights of Columbus, and Ladies Guild members, please log on to the VIRTUS system as soon as possible to complete the required training which includes electronic acknowledgment of three diocesan policies, completion of online video training, and an application for a background check.

Even if you have had training in the past, there are new components that are now required. To access the system, visit virtusonline.org.
