Dear Dorper & White Dorper Exhibitor and/or Breeder,



The Chisholm Trail Dorper Association (CTDA) is hosting its 6th annual futurity ewe sale, youth show & educational event on June 3rd & 4th in Corsicana, TX. Friday there will be a youth clinic hosted by our youth board of directors. They will work on showmanship, nutrition, feeding & health. At the conclusion of the clinic there will be a showmanship competition. Winners will be awarded prizes in each division. Production interviews will be held on Friday. Saturday we will have the production class followed youth show (10 pm). **Like last year the barn will be open on Thursday starting at 3pm for early move-in.**

Youth Clinic & Showmanship– Friday, June 3rd 9:00am

Our youth board of directors will host a special youth clinic Friday from 9:00am-3:00pm. This clinic is free to all CTYDA youth members. They will cover showmanship, nutrition, feeding and health of your show animals. At the conclusion of the youth event there will be a showmanship competition for the following ages: Pee Wee, Junior, Intermediate & senior. Also, there will be a special event for the adults (judged by the kids) “Old Timers Show”. We will also have our special tiny pee wee division as well for those under the age of 8 that need assistance. Any purebred or fullblood registered Dorper or white Dorper regardless of the owner can be shown.

Youth Sheep Production – Saturday 9am

The goal of this division is to showcase the production of Dorper females and their offspring. Producers appreciate traits such as excellent daily gains, early maturing, fertility and feed efficiency. A record book of production, daily gains from birth to show date and associated costs to produce each animal will be kept and turned into the show secretary by 5pm June 1, 2022 for judging before the live show and interview. All production books will be done online. The link for the record book will be sent once animal(s) are registered.

Futurity Ewe Sale – Saturday, June 19th 10am

The futurity ewe sale will be online with the entries due May 20th. Auction will be open from May 28th thru 5pm June 3rd. Each consignor is limited to three (3) individual entries per ranch, the association reserves the right to limit the entries if too many are received. To consign a futurity lamb in the sale, you must be a member of the Chisholm Trail Youth Dorper Association – Breeder Sponsor (CTYDA) as well as a member in good standing with the ADSBS. All futurity ewes must already be registered with the ADSBS. **All futurity ewes must have papers at the time of check in to be qualified for the sale. They will also go through a sifting committee to ensure there are no cull faults or sub-standard quality.** All decisions of this committee are final and cannot be appealed. Culled sheep will not be allowed to sale. **There is a \$35 nomination fee due to the “ADSBS” for all ewes nominated. This will need to be paid prior to the sale.** Ewe lambs must be born between September 2021 – April 2022.

Breeding Dorper Show General Guidelines - Saturday, June 4th 9am

Entry fees for the youth show will be \$25 per entry. Payment and entry forms are due May 20th, but sheep that are purchased through the sale will be allowed to enter that day. Late entries will not be accepted.

All entries in the Youth Breeding Show must be registered in the youth's name and the youth must be a member of the Chisholm Trail Youth Dorper Association. **A complete list of the classes offered is available in the "Youth Sheep Show" handout.**

2021 CTDA Youth Sheep Show

June 3rd & 4th – Corsicana, TX – Judge: Loyd Nations

There will be four breeding showmanship classes, with buckles for champions and prizes for all participants:

- a) Senior
- b) Intermediate
- c) Junior
- d) Pee Wee

Production Class – See flyer with details for this event

Breeding sheep classes: Separate divisions for Dorper and White Dorper

- 1) Aged Ram (born on or before Aug 31, 2020; carrying all teeth)
- 2) Yearling Ram (born Sept 1, 2020 to Aug 31, 2021)
- 3) Fall Ram Lamb (Sept 1, 2021 to Dec 30, 2021)
- 4) Spring Ram Lamb (Jan 1, 2022 to April 30, 2022) will be broken down further if there are enough entries
- 5) Pair of Rams
- 6) Champion & Reserve Champion Rams
- 7) Aged Ewe (born on or before Aug 31, 2020; carrying all teeth)
- 8) Yearling Ewe (born Sept 1, 2020 to Aug 31, 2021) will be broken down further if needed
- 9) Early Fall Ewe Lamb (Sept 1, 2021 to Oct 31, 2021)
- 10) Late Fall Ewe Lamb (Nov 1, 2021-Dec 31, 2021)
- 11) Winter Ewe Lamb (born Jan 1, 2022 to Feb 28, 2022)
- 12) Spring Ewe Lamb (born Mar 1, 2022 to April 30, 2022)
- 13) Pair of Ewes
- 14) Champion & Reserve Champion Ewes
- 15) Best Pair (one ram and one ewe owned by same exhibitor, previously shown)
- 16) Flock - one ram (any age), 2 ewes (yearling or aged) and 2 ewe lambs (9/1/2021-4/30/2022)
- 17) Premier Exhibitor



Show Rules

- 1) All exhibitors must be CTYDA members in good standing (dues paid for 2022).
- 2) All sheep shown must be ADSBS registered in the name of the junior exhibitor (not in family or ranch name). Animals may be jointly owned by multiple junior exhibitors. Animals purchased in the 2022 CTDA Sale in the name of the junior exhibitor may be shown by post entry following the sale.
- 3) There is no minimum age for exhibitors, but the junior exhibitor must show their animal by controlling the head. Another junior exhibitor may assist in the ring as a heeler (set hind legs).
- 4) All sheep must be properly washed and sheared.
- 5) Sheep may be shown with or without halters in all classes and should not be driven according to ASBS guidelines.
- 6) Entry fee is \$25 per head on individual. Group classes \$3, and showmanship is free.
- 7) All youth show sheep must be penned and checked in by 8am, June 4th. All sheep must carry USDA scrapie identification tags. Health papers are not required for Texas exhibitors.
- 8) Banners for champions and ribbons for classes will be awarded.
- 9) Premier exhibitor – This will be award based on a point system: 1st place – 5 points, 2nd place – 4 points, 3rd place – 3 points, 4th place – 2 points, 5th place – 1 point. No points will be given for champions or group classes. One overall premier exhibitor will be awarded per breed.

Entry Deadline May 20th No late entries will be accepted. Animals purchased through the youth sale will be able to enter at the regular entry price the day of the event. Entries online www.chisholmtraildorpers.com

 - **Old Timer Showmanship** – will start immediately following the breeding showmanship (entries will be open at 4:00 and be taken through the showmanship classes. Any one that wishes to opt out has to do so no later than the conclusion of the prior class). The opt out fee will be \$20 and all proceeds will go towards our new scholarship fund.
- **5:00** – Production Interviews
- **6:00** – Dinner provided by the Richter family

- **8:00** – All sheep must be checked in for the youth show
- **9:00** – Live production show

2021 CTYDA Youth Sheep Production

June 3rd – Corsicana, TX

The goal of this division is to showcase the production of Dorper females and their offspring. Producers appreciate traits such as excellent daily gains, early maturing, fertility and feed efficiency. A record book of production, daily gains from birth to show date and associated costs to produce each animal will be kept and turned into the show secretary by June 1st 5pm for judging before the live show and interview. Record books will be tracked in google slides and turned in online. The cost for production is \$25, however if you are also showing the ewe in the show there is a \$15 discount (use code PRODUCTION) at check out.

Final placings and determination of “Champion sheep producer” will be based off a combined score of the following:

Live show Ewe & Offspring (50%)

Record Book (30%)

Interview (20%)

Show Rules

- 1) The show is open to Dorper and White Dorper sheep, breeds will show together.
- 2) The ewe and lamb(s) MUST be owned by the exhibitor.
- 3) The ewe MUST have already lambed and MUST be the dam of the lamb(s) being shown.
- 4) Lambs should be born in 2022, and do not need to be weaned from the ewe.
- 5) Lambs may be wethers, ewes or rams.
- 6) An exhibitor may show no more than (2) ewe/lamb projects in this division.
- 7) Ribbons will be awarded for 1st to 6th place.
- 8) Ewes must be sheared with at least a cover coat blade. Lambs not weaned can be shown naturally, weaned lambs should be slick sheared.
- 9) A champion and reserve champion award in each age division will be awarded based on the combined score above.
- 10) The following classes will be offered (based on grade as of Fall 2021):
 - a. Junior – Currently in 4th grade or younger
 - b. Intermediate – Currently in 5th grade thru 8th grade
 - c. Senior – Currently in 9th through 12th grade
